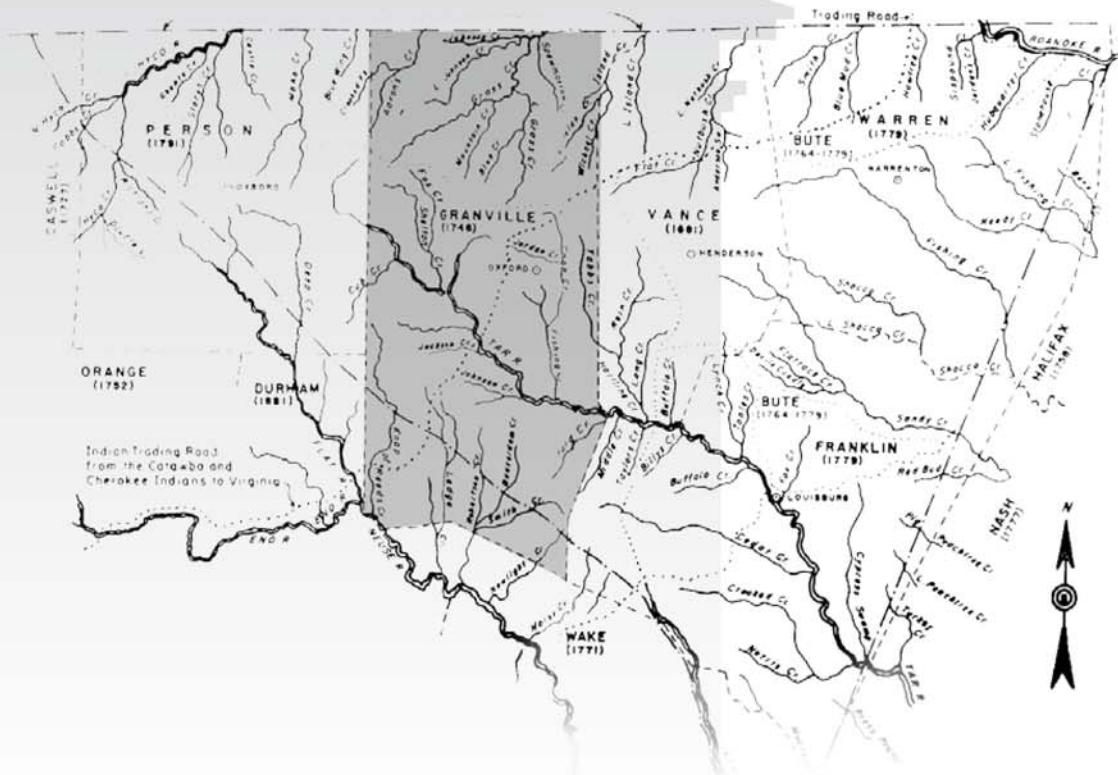

Epidemics in the United States - 1633 - 1952

Epidemics have always had a great influence on people -- and thus influencing, as well, the genealogists trying to trace them. Many cases of people disappearing from records can be traced to dying during an epidemic or moving away from the affected area. Some of the major epidemics in the United States are listed below:

1633 Massachusetts: (Indians) Smallpox, probably brought on arriving ships of settlers. At least 15 children died on incoming ships, as well as about 20 colonists already resident.

1634 Connecticut: Smallpox, introduced by Dutch traders and killed 95% of the Indians and spread north into Canada.

1648-49 Massachusetts colony: Another smallpox outbreak and of whooping cough.

1657 Boston: Measles

1687 Boston: Measles

1690 New York: Yellow Fever

1699 Charleston, SC: Yellow fever; probably about 160-190 died.

1702 New York: Yellow fever killing more than 500 people over a three-month period.

1702-03 Boston: Smallpox, again, and scarlet fever about 300 died.

1706 Charleston, SC: Yellow fever again. About 5% of the population died.

1713 Boston: Measles

1873-75 North America & Europe: Influenza

1878 Southern States: over 13,000 people died from yellow fever in lower Mississippi Valley.

1885 Plymouth, PA: Typhoid

1886 Jacksonville, Fl: Yellow Fever

1893-94 Boston, New England, Vermont: Polio in the U.S. began of 132 cases documented in Vermont, there were 18 deaths and 30 victims left with permanent paralysis.

1901-03 New York and northeast U.S.: Smallpox

1907-16 New York: Polio turned into a major problem in the U.S.

1916 Nationwide: over 7,000 deaths occurred and 27,363 cases were reported of polio (infantile paralysis) in America's worst polio epidemic.

1917-19 Nationwide: outbreak of Spanish influenza killed over 500,000 people in the worst single U.S. epidemic. More people hospitalized in World War I from Influenza than wounds. US Army training camps became death camps --with 80 percent death rate in some camps.

1931 Another outbreak of polio during the summer of 1931, killing more than 4,000 people, about 12 percent of the reported cases.

1942-53 Polio continued to ravage the U.S., peaking in 1952 with about 60,000 cases. This was the worst epidemic since 1916.

In the name of God I Roger Badget of the county of Granville & state of North Carolina being in helth of body and perfect mind & sound memory but calling to mind that is _____ (unable to decipher) by the almighty executor for immortal men once to die therefore am willing that what it hath pleased God to bestores on me as to my temporal goods I give & bequeath as followeth & my soul I recommend into my saviors hands who redeemed with his precious blood & my body I recommend to the grave to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named.

Item: I promise I give & bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Badget during her natural life my land & plantation whereon I now live & after her death I give the same to my daughter Rachel Goss I als give & bequeath to my wife one featherbed & furniture, three cows & calves, one mare & saddle, fifteen hogs, one duck, three chears, two wheales, one linen, one woolen, one pot rack, one dish, three plates, two basons, one foying hose, one table, one sifter, four sheep & fifty pounds Virginia money, two pairs of card, one box _____ (unable to decipher due to paper torn) one hackle to her

Item: I give unto my beloved wife Priscilla Badget one negro woman named Fanny & her futer increase to her & her heirs and or assignees & forever also one feather bed and furniture, also my will and desire is that my said wife Priscilla shall live on the land whereon I now live during her life and have liberty to cultivate any part of each tract or tracts of land during her life without molestation but shall not turn off my son Andrew Badgett nor prohibit him from cultivating any part of said lands that she does not cultivate herself.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Andrew Badget (after the death of my said wife Priscilla) all and singular my lands & tenements to him, his heirs & assignees forever.

Item: I give unto my son Jesse Badgett (after the death of my said wife Priscilla) one negro boy named Cajah to him his heirs & assignees forever.

Item: I give unto my two sons William & Andrew Badgett four negroes (to wit) a negro woman named Jenny & her three children that is Arter, Annara & Leathy to them their heirs & assignees in trust for the following use that is to say that the said William & Andrew Badget or their survivors furnish from year to year my daughter Drucilla Badgett as long as she lives single with as much provisions or money as the said negroes & their increases shall reasonably be worth or permit her the said Drucilla to have the use of said negroes & their increase as they shall think most for the bebenefit of said daughter and of both trustees as a foresaid should die before marriage of my said daughter Drucilla then their heirs or assignees shall have full power to execute this trust and also if my daughter Drucilla should marry Ephriam Frazer then it shall be the duty of said trustees to cause the said negroes that is Jenny, Arter, Annara & Leathy and their increase to be divided equally between my seven sons their heirs and assignees or if she the said Drucilla should marry any other person except the said Ehpriam then it shall be the duty of said trustees to cause the said negroes to wit Jenny Arter Annara & Leathey (the three children of said Jenny) to be delivered up to said Drucilla as her own property to her heirs & assignees forever.

Item: After all my just debts & funeral expenses are paid and fifty dollars to be saved for my son James Badget after the death of my wife Priscilla and all the remaining part of property after the death of my said wife shall be equally divided amongst my seven sons and one daughter (to wit) Peter, William, Jonathan, Benton, James, Andrew, Jesse and Drucilla Badget to them their heirs & assignees, but the part

that falleth to the said Drucilla shall be in the hands of said trustee as above mentioned.
