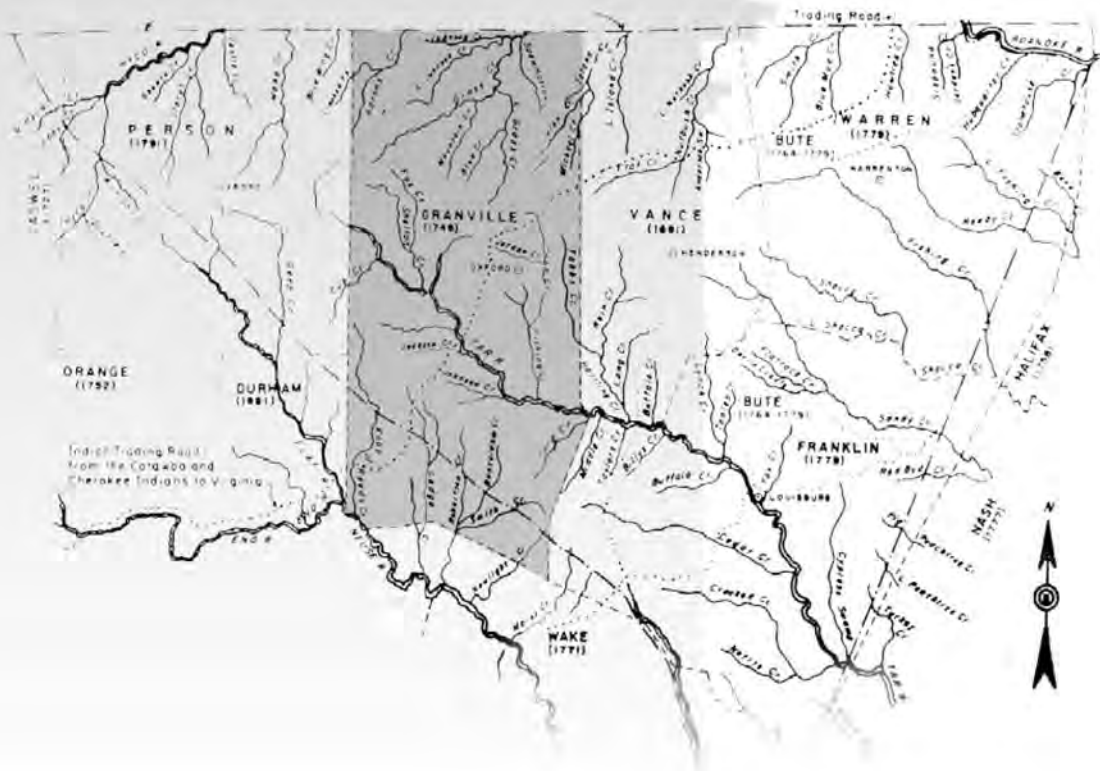

From the President—

Where has the time gone? When you are researching your family ties, you forget the time especially when you find that part of the goldmine in your family. I have been busy making connections in my grandmother's family from Mecklenburg County, Virginia. She was raised on the North Carolina/Virginia line. Coming down through the family members, it was told that the family ate in one state and slept in the other. How was this possible? The house was located in the state line. The North Carolina/ Virginia line was moved and the old home place now is in Mecklenburg County, Virginia.

We took a vacation in July so we could travel to family reunions and catch up on some of our research.

In August we had our "Show and Tell" program. This turns out to be a very interesting program. We learned a lot from members showing their heirlooms and family stories. Also what they have found in their research.

In September we had the most interesting program on "Roots Magic" presented by our own webmaster Allen Dew. Roots Magic 7 is the easiest genealogy software available today. You start with basic data entry and you continue by learning advanced techniques such as custom reports, citing your sources, GEDCOM, creating user defined facts, scanning images and merging. You mix that with time saving shortcuts and you will have a complete understanding of Roots Magic and its hidden powers. Points

to remember you can create a detailed family history. You can properly document your entire family history for future generations, publish your family history, add your photos to bring your family to life, you can create customized wall charts, organize your unfinished research and you can share your family history online.

Allen gave us down to earth instructions so all of us could understand the technology of the program. Also he told us that the program indexes the names as you go into the database. This alone is a lifesaver as it would take months to index our family histories the old way.

If you are wondering what numbering style to use, it lets you choose which what number to print in front of each person in the report.

1. NGSQ / NEHGS – register format
2. Outline – Outline numbering (I,A, 1,a,etc.
3. Henry – 1,11,111,etc.
4. D'Aboville – 1, 1.1, 1.1.1, etc.

Another plus for this program is a book of down to earth instructions which can be bought at a very reasonable price.

The Creedmoor Cemetery

As one of the Trustees of the cemetery in question, I have been recently helping to sort out ownership of the cemetery in Creedmoor. When we catalogued this cemetery back in early 2000 we were under the impression that it belonged to the city of Creedmoor. We found out earlier this year that it belonged part to Creedmoor and part to the Rogers brothers. It has been a long

drawn out process so far and we have a long way to go to get it straightened out. We do have an attorney helping us. All of this was brought to our attention when the caretaker of the records died earlier in the year. Poor record keeping was the culprit. Hopefully we will have it cleared and we will republish the entire cemetery listing through "Cemetery Census", which is owned by our webmaster. There are a lot of missing names that are not listed in our first publication and this will be corrected.

The Land Grant System in North Carolina

This system has been used from the very beginning of the colony to the present time. The last land grant made by the state of NC was in 1957.

There are Five Major Divisions in the History of the Land Grants in North Carolina

1. Proprietary Grants
2. Crown Grants
3. Granville Grants
4. State Grants
5. Tennessee and Military Grants

1. PROPRIETARY GRANTS:

The Province of Carolina was granted to eight men who were friends of King Charles II. Given the title of Lords Proprietors their grant included the land south of the Va. border to present day Cape Kennedy, Fl. Land which they sold to prospective settlers were called Proprietary Land Grants. There is only one index drawer in the card catalogue of the Land Grant Office which has Proprietary Grants. This is by name only, not by county. All known Proprietary Grants from 1663 to 1729 are recorded in the books of the Land Grant Office. A few grants are known to have been made by Sir William Berkeley, Governor of VA. Berkeley was one of the original Lords Proprietors, grants made by him are recorded in VA. We do have one book which has some of these abstracts.

2. CROWN GRANTS:

The British Crown bought Carolina back from the Proprietors, with the exception of Lord Granville, in 1729. From then until 1745 the Governor of NC issued grants for land any place in the colony. From 1745 until 1775 the Governor issued grants for lands only in the southern part of NC. Grants issued by the Governor were called Crown Grants. The Crown Land Office closed in 1775 and there are no Crown Grants after that date. The format for issuing crown grants was similar to the system mention earlier. There were some differences in the procedure. Entries for Crown Grants were usually compiled in a list by the Sec. of State. He then took the list to the Governor and Council of State and they approved or disapproved these entries for land. Such lists are published in the **Colonial & State Records of North Carolina**, where they are referred to as petitions for land. Except for these lists there is usually no evidence for entries for Crown Land. The same is true for Crown Warrants. Almost none have survived for the period before 1765. Known Crown Grants are recorded in the Land Grant Office.

3. GRANVILLE GRANTS:

John Carteret, Earl of Granville, was the one Lord Proprietor who refused to sell his portion of Carolina back to the Crown in 1729. His part of the 1663 Charter was the northern half of NC. If you draw a line on the map of NC about a mile above Smithfield running it from the ocean to the mountains you will have a picture of what Lord Granville owned. His property ran from this line north to the border of Virginia. It is interesting to note that the northern part of Old Dobbs County, as well as other early counties that suffered records losses, fell into the Granville Land Grant area.

Lord Granville opened a Land Office where grants were issued from about 1745 until 1763. Granville died in 1763 and before his estate could be settled the American Revolution broke out preventing the reopening of his land office. After trying, unsuccessfully, for many years following the war the heirs finally gave up the effort to regain the lands. Records of Granville's Land Office were seized by the State during the Revolutionary War. The majority of these records are in the custody of the NC State Archives although some are in the Sec. of State's Land Grant Office.

The Land Grant Office has the warrants to many of his grants and a few of the plats. The State Archives has Entries, Warrants, Surveys, and Grants from the Granville Land Grant Office. There is a card catalogue index to only the Grants.

4. STATE GRANTS:

The State of North Carolina assumed title to all vacant land within its boundaries during the Revolutionary War. The state promptly opened a Land Grant Office in every county in both the Granville and old Crown District. Land was sold to anyone who could pay the fees.

Warrants and surveys from State Grants are in the Land Grant Office. All State Grants are recorded in the Land Grant Books.

The entry books were county records and these are in the NC State Archives.

5. TENNESSEE AND MILITARY GRANTS:

A. Tennessee Grants:

What is present day Tennessee was a part of NC until 1790, when the area was ceded to the Federal Government. NC made grants in the area 1778 to 1790 just as it did in other parts of NC.

The state of Tennessee had them copied in 1803 but the original records of NC Land Grants in Tennessee are in the Sec. of State's Land Grant Office. There is an index to the land grants which are filed by name only rather than by county.

B. Military Grants:

As a means of recruiting soldiers for the Continental Line of NC during the Revolutionary War the state government promised free land in what was then western NC and is present day Tennessee. This land was limited to Continental Line soldiers **not** militia soldiers.

Grants issued to soldiers stated they were being granted for "signal bravery and persevering zeal" or "services of i.e., John Doe, surveyor or chain bearer etc." of the land allotted the officers and men of the Continental Line. It may help you to remember the difference between the two if you think of the Continental Line as being like present day regular line and the militia as present day National Guard.

Military land grants were all in Sumner and Davidson counties Tennessee. Records of these military grants can be difficult to use. It will be helpful if you have a gazetteer of NC & TN as most of these land grants are on water courses.

Do your research – don't believe everything you see!

I am sure that many of you do your own research, require sources for information you find on the internet before you actually believe it to be true, but there are some that don't appear to. This particular article is written to prove a few points in genealogy about how you MUST do research to ensure the information you have is indeed correct. As I have done more research on my given surname, Perdue, I have found a few things that I find incorrect.

Case One:

My first case is the death date of my great-grandfather, George Andrew Perdue. A relative was kind enough to take me to a local family cemetery and show me the grave of our shared ancestor. I'm not sure I would have found this without his help and for that I am grateful beyond any words. George Andrew Perdue was buried in a 'Family Cemetery'. He was the son of Macon L. Perdue and Lucy Vaughan Harris born on October 12, 1850 (oddly enough, my sister was born on October 12 many years later). He died on Mar. 28, 1929. This information was provided by his tombstone.



Here's a photograph of his tombstone – pretty simple, huh? On this same research trip (back in the year 2000 before a lot of information was online and available on Ancestry.com) I went to the local library in Henderson, North Carolina. The library has microfilm of the newspapers for this time period. I found the film containing the correct dates, searched for his obituary starting with March 28 and going out a week. Nothing was found. Since he died after death certificates started being created, I went over to the local court house and looked for his death certificate and an interesting thing happened. His death certificate said he died on February 28, 1929. What, the tombstone is wrong? Apparently it is in this case – the tombstone clearly says March, yet the death certificate says February.

I went back to the library and looked for his obituary using the correct date of February 28, 1929 and found it without any problems. Look closely at the obituary – do you see the other discrepancy? I don't know what's correct as I don't have any information to assist in verification but it's clear that the tombstone is not necessarily correct in this particular case.

FUNERAL HELD FOR GEORGE A. PERDUE

Burial in Family Cemetery Near City

Thursday Afternoon – Number of Relatives Survive

Funeral services for George A. Perdue were conducted yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock at his residence near Henderson, burial taking place at the family cemetery near there. The deceased was born in Halifax County, October 22, 1850, but came to Henderson in the early part

of his life, and since then has lived near here.

He is survived by his widow, who was Miss Belle Vaughan of this city, nine children and 25 grand children, three nephews and one niece. The children are: F. A. and W. C. Perdue, of Raleigh, Mrs. J. H. Edwards, of Epsom; Mrs. W. S. Strange, Mrs. D. H. Carter, Mrs. H. B. Clapton, Mrs. George Rooker, Miss Flora Perdue and George Ollie Perdue, of this city. The nieces and nephews surviving often are E. M. Harris, of this city; John Perdue of Los Angeles, California; Jim Perdue and Mrs. F. J. Reedy, of Nashville, Tenn.

Case Two:

Ancestry.com family trees are often not sourced and often copied from one another – but who actually does the research? One would assume someone does – right? Since this particular error seems to be in many (maybe all) of the family trees, I can only guess that one person put the information together and many others copied it. In this particular case I am reviewing the various individuals that are “Survivors” of George Andrew Perdue. Those outside of the North Carolina area I had to research and find out who they are (I found all that information and have sources.) My question was “E. M. Harris, of this city” is listed as a nephew. Who is this nephew? Many of you may have read the article I recently published in the Granville Connections on Edgar M. Harris – but this particular case is to provide sources of what happens on Ancestry family trees.

Source 1: Obituary for George Andrew Perdue mentions he has a nephew named “E. M. Harris”.

The 1850 United States census lists the family of George Andrew Perdue although George is not in this census entry since he was not born until October 1850. The census entry lists the following:

M. L. Perdue, age 30, born about 1820 in North Carolina. The home in 1850 is Gaston, Northampton County, North Carolina, Family Number 1324. Others in the household are:

- L V Perdue, 31 (assumed wife, Lucy Vaughan)
- Alice M Perdue, 6 (assumed daughter)
- Gustav H Perdue, 4 (assumed son)
- Virginia C Perdue, 3 (assumed daughter)
- Martha Vaughan, 25 (assumed sister in law)
- Littlebury Crawley, 22 (assumed boarder; maybe worked with Macon)

It's unfortunate that this census taker wrote the names of "Macon L. and Lucy V. Perdue" as initials only as this required more research to ensure this is indeed the correct family. Macon and Lucy are listed on the death certificate for George Andrew Perdue. Lucy died shortly after the birth of George (no source information, but provided via the same cousin who provided information on where George was buried).

Source 2: 1850 United States Census listing everyone except for George Andrew Perdue. Unfortunately both Lucy and Macon died before the 1860 census and the children were split across several relatives.

Question: If Ed M. Harris is the nephew of George Andrew Perdue, then he must be the son of one of his sisters – either Virginia C. Perdue or Alice M. Perdue – correct?
 Our next search is to see if I can find any man marrying either of these women and having a surname of "Harris".

I have searched and searched but never been able to find out anything about this particular Alice M. Perdue. I did find that the family photograph I currently possess and labeled as "Alice Perdue" was dated as too young to be this Alice Perdue – further research proved that Gustav H. Perdue (Augustus H. Perdue) married and had a daughter named Alice Perdue – the photograph appears to be the correct age for it to be a photo of her.

If I couldn't find Alice, let's try to find Virginia C. Perdue. My first stop was to check Ancestry.com – I found several family trees that have this information:

Virginia C. Perdue

Birth 8 April 1848, Granville County, North Carolina formed 1746 from Edgecombe County

Death 26 Nov 1923, Six Mile, Pickens, South Carolina, USA

Wow – this looks promising! The birth date appears correct, in the correct area (although it appears my Virginia C. Perdue was born in Northampton County not Granville County). A sinking feeling as it says she died in Pickens, South Carolina and I was vacationing there a few years ago and was clueless I was so close – I could have gotten the obituary at the library and her death certificate – maybe even a marriage certificate. The family tree lists her parents as Macon L

Perdue and Lucy Vaughan – that information matches what I have. Virginia C. Perdue married Elias C. Collier on 19 August 1869 in Granville, North Carolina, USA. A source is attached, it is the 1900 census.

This particular census entry does list a Virginia having been born in North Carolina (her parents too). She was born the correct year, must be her?

Let's step back a minute – how do we know this Virginia is the correct Virginia – our Virginia C. Perdue? After all, I have a nephew “Ed M. Harris” that needs to be connected somehow to one of these two sisters (Alice or Virginia). I sent messages to many of the people having this information in the family tree – “Hi, I am related – can you tell me your source for this marriage and how you know or believe this is Virginia C. Perdue?” – ZERO response.

Maybe they are all wrong? I kept searching. Finally, on FamilySearch.org I found this entry!

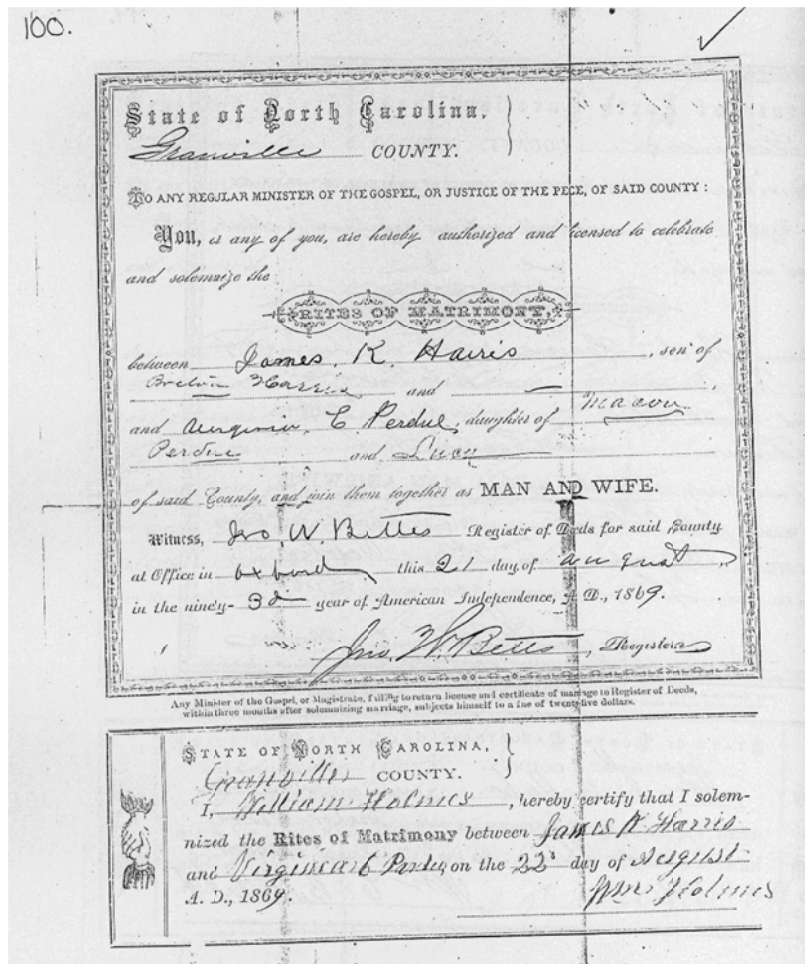

So, here's a good clue that Virginia (misspelled in the translation) married a "Jas. B. Harris". No image available on Ancestry.com. I don't know who "Breton Harris" is, but the parents of Virginia match. And it's a Harris!

After more searching, I am unable to find a copy of the marriage online. My next step was to contact Mark Pace at the Richard H. Thornton library. Mark is a very helpful resource and I've reached out to him over many years. He responded very quickly – they didn't have the marriage on microfilm but they had a Xerox copy and attached it – WOW!!! I can't thank Mark enough!



Here it is! I'm not sure if this is "James K Harris" or some other middle initial because the 1880 census lists a J. R. Harris, FamilySearch.org has a "Jas B. Harris" and the marriage certificate itself almost looks like "James K. Harris".

Source 3: Marriage certificate between James K/B/R Harris and Virginia C. Perdue listing her parents as Macon Perdue and Lucy -----

They married in 1869 – where are they in the 1870 census? I honestly at this writing have not been able to find them yet.

However, I did find them in the 1880 census. I found a J. R. Harris, age 33, born about 1847 in North Carolina. The family is living in Sandy Creek area of Warren County, North Carolina. The spouse is listed as Virginia Harris. J. R. Harris is a harness maker. The family is listed as follows:

- J. R. Harris, 33
- Virginia Harris, 32
- Eddy M. Harris, 10
- Andrew J. Harris, 6
- Jenny M. Harris, 3

NOTE: Eddy M. Harris could be our "Ed M. Harris"; Jenny M. Harris could be Virginia M. Harris and quite possibly Andrew J. Harris is "Andrew Jackson Harris" of which there are several with this name in this area.

Source 4: Year: 1880; Census Place: Sandy Creek, Warren, North Carolina; Roll: 985; Family History Film: 1254985; Page: 103B; Enumeration District: 285

NOTE: If you review Granville Connections, June 2017, Volume 23, Number 2 you will find some shared information along with the obituary and death certificate for Ed M. Harris (who is actually Edgar M. Harris – perhaps the "M" stands for Macon – his grandfather, but no evidence has been found yet to indicate).

In summation, I've presented my case for why I believe the family trees on Ancestry.com are reporting incorrectly that Virginia C. Perdue married Elias C. Collier. What do you believe?

Regardless of whether you believe one case or another, I personally wanted to provide information that lets you know, as a genealogist, a family historian or just a researcher that you need to find out as much as you can about the family and be able to support your evidence and family tree with sources that will ensure you have creditability in your research.
