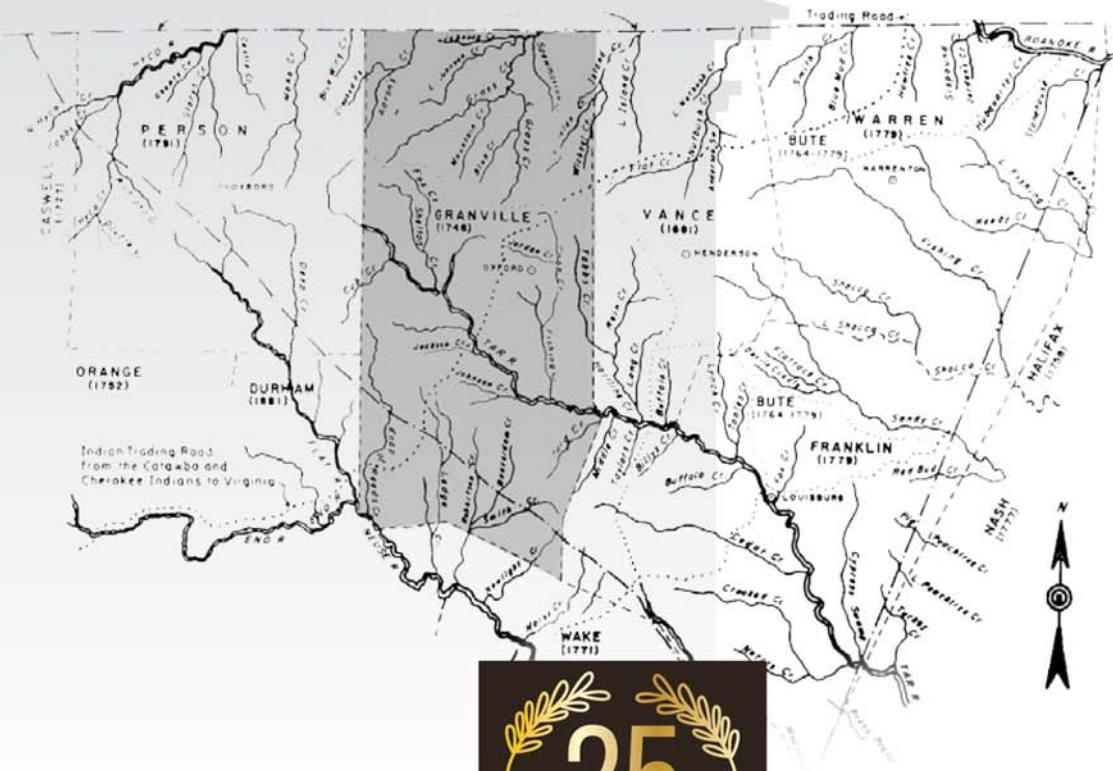

Due to circumstances beyond my control the list of our donations to the NC Room at the Thornton Library will be completed in the next issue.

I had the misfortune of being admitted to Duke Hospital for a breathing problem to start with, but to my surprise it turned into a serious heart problem. I was diagnosed with severe mitral regurgitation. I was an inpatient for eight days so they could get the fluids out of my lung. Then I was sent home to wait until December 16 and was readmitted for the MitraClip Procedure on December 17. This was successfully performed without any complications.

The RN did suggest that I stay away from crowds until I am seen by my Cardiologist on January 13 due to the Flu season in full force.

Elliott Family of Granville County

by J. Lauriston Elliott and Charles W. Dean, Oxford NC

Lauriston Elliott was born November 13th, 1870. He was one of nine children born to Leroy S. Elliott (1844-1913) and Laura Elliott (1851-1926). Lauriston married Emma Wilbourn in 1890. She was born on August 11th 1873 to Harper Wilbourn (b. 1849) and Nannie Elliott (b. 1854).

Lauriston and Emma operated a post office and general store at Adoniram NC 15 miles north of Oxford. This area is now called Cornwall community in Granville County.

This building was rebuilt in 1906, and still stands a tenth of a mile off the west side of Cornwall Rd. at the end of the George Winston Rd. The location of the building was first called Young's Crossroads, for Dr. Young who lived there, before moving to the house George Winston would later live in. Young's crossroads post office was established March 15, 1873, with Marcus D. Royster (Postmaster). Lauriston Elliott became postmaster February 17, 1904. Young's Crossroad's was a main intersection in northern Granville Co., with Grassy Creek and Stovall to the East, Virginia, VA to the west, Oxford to the South and Nelson, VA to the north. It was an

early stagecoach water stop.

Lauriston and Emma had seven children, Julian Carr Elliott, (b 1900-d.1982) Helen Grey Elliot (b.5/24/1902-d.10/28/1976), Lauriston Conway Elliott (b.6/5/1904-d.10/31/1986), Opie Carita Elliott (b.03/30/1906-d.03/30/1986), Gladys May Elliott (b.03/14/1908-d.09/30/1954), Raymond Jordan Elliott (b.10/20/1915-d.12/23/1989), Infant son (b.07/09/1913-d.07/15/1913) another infant (born 1-28-1910 died 1-29-1910.)

Julian C. Elliott graduated in 1920 from Cary High School in Cary, NC, and then Wake Forest College and later University of Maryland Medical School in Baltimore, Md. Julian married Jean Kennerly (b.1903-d.1980), who was from Baltimore, Md. He practiced medicine in Oxford, NC except for a period during World War II, when he served as a Major in the Medical Corps. Julian and Jean had no children. They are both buried in Meadowview Cemetery, Oxford, NC.

Helen G. Elliott married Charlie David Winston (1899-1991), he was a tobacco farmer. Helen attended Meredith College and Trinity College now known as Duke University. She and Charlie had four children, Marion Winston who married Francis B. Dean, Charlie David Winston Jr. who married Eunice M. Royster, Julian Ward Winston who married Nancy B. Christie and Elliott Ward Winston who died as an infant.

Helen and Charlie had seven grandchildren: Laura Dean Blackley, Sandra Dean Pruitt, Charles W. Dean, Rebecca Winston Desrosiers, Jean Marie Winston Borst, Julian Warren Winston and Judy Winston Smith. There are nine great grandchildren, Edgar Landon Blackley, Nash Dean Blackley, Carson Lane Blackely, James Scott Pruitt, Harper Grey Pruitt, Lauren Marie Borst, Jeffery Winston, Ashley Winston, Evan Vienneau. Helen and Charlie are buried in Grassy Creek Baptist Church Cemetery.

Lauriston Conway Elliott married Lelia Nolen (b.11/13/1907-d.02/14/1996). After graduating from Stovall High School in Granville County, Conway became a farmer. He was a lifelong member of Grassy Creek Baptist.

Conway and Lelia had two sons Lauriston Kennerly Elliot who married Margaret Ann Henderson and Larry Thomas Elliott who married Jean Dover. Conway and Lelia had five grandchildren, Alice Elliott Bond, David K. Elliott, Scott T. Elliott, Todd B. Elliott and Gina Elliott Kim. There are eleven great grandchildren, Ruben Michael Bond, Ryan David Bond, Conner Elliott, Cody Elliott, Carson Elliott, Katy Elliott, Clark Elliott, Blake Elliott, Meredith Kim, Addison Kim, and Mackenzie Kim. Conway and Lelia are buried in Grassy Creek Baptist Church Cemetery.

Opie C. Elliott and Gladys M. Elliott graduated from Stovall High School. Gladys graduated from Meredith College in 1929. Both moved from their home in Adoniram, NC in 1940 to live with their sister, Helen and brother-in-law Charlie in the Grassy Creek community. Both were active members in Grassy Creek Baptist Church and are buried in the church cemetery.

Raymond J. Elliot married Mable Virginia Eakes (b.08/16/1914-d.03/24/1991) Raymond and Mable both graduated from Oak Hill High School. Raymond graduated from Wake Forest College and Mable graduated from Meredith College. They both were teachers, Mable retiring after thirty years. Raymond taught school, farmed and was a truant officer. They lived at Adoniram NC from the mid 1940's until their deaths. The old home burned in 1951. Raymond and Mable's son J.

Lauriston Elliott (b.12/08/1943) and his wife Hilda Talley Elliott (b.11/21/1943) were married 05/08/1970 and moved to Adoniram in April 1992. Their son, Michael J. Elliott and wife Alice Mills Elliott and grandson J. Dylan Elliott live on the farm also.

John Henry Daniel (1865-1940), grandson of Josiah, whose family moved from Albemarle County Virginia to purchase 520 acres on both sides of Grassy Creek in Granville County on February 7, 1775, married Mary "Mollie" Booker Currin (1866-1936) in 1889 and lived ten miles south of Oxford.

They were married for 47 years and are pictures with their fourteen children: Bessie Ann, Lillie Mae, Fred Henderson, Hallie Ruth, Roy Clifton, Mamie Ethel, Joe Herbert, John William "Buck", Armie Adams, Floy Gabrielle, Elizabeth "Lizzie" Stuart, Osby Lee, Ruby Inez and Aubrey Glenn. Once when asked how many children he had, John Henry answered, "I have seven sons and each son has a sister apiece." "Man alive!" the man exclaimed, "You mean you have forty-nine children?" He had multiplied rather than added.

John Henry's father, William Henry "Buck" Daniel served with Co. G. 30 Regiment, N.C. Infantry and Mollie's father, Robert S. Currin was an aide to General Robert E. Lee.

The seventh daughter and thirteenth child Ruby Inez Daniel Udvarnoki became a Hungarian Missionary prior to WW-II and described corn-shucking time on their large farm. For two days beforehand there would be feverish preparation going on in the kitchen. Hams were baked, chickens were dressed, pies and cakes baked. Her papa would let her stand near the corn pile but far enough away to avoid being hit by the long ears of white corn as they were whirled into the crisp October air. She enjoyed watching the pale brown ears from one pile decrease to form the huge mountain of white ears nearby.

The teasing, joking crowd of men would finally lay down their wooden corn pegs and start to the house to eat. It kept her sisters Bessie, Hallie, Lillie, and Mamie busy bringing second helpings of chicken, gravy, creamed potatoes, pickles, fresh port, ham, vegetables, etc. After the corn was packed safely in the crib and the cane was made into good old molasses, they knew it would soon be cold enough to kill hogs. When all those important things had been finished, there was next summer's wood supply to be cut and brought to the wood house.

The Daniel clan's first years of school life began at a two-teacher school two miles from their home at Cannady's Mill with Miss Ett Washington as principal and Miss Mary Webb the other teacher. They also walked to the church, which was within sight of their home. All the wonderful experiences of growing up in such a large family convinced her that she had the grandest family any child ever owned.

Floyd Family of Granville County

The first Floyd to arrive on America soil was Nathaniel Floyd in 1623. At age 23, Nathaniel landed in Virginia with his own sea sailing ship called the Nova. He arrived from Wales crossing the Atlantic Ocean with 16 people aboard. We are unsure of the connection between Nathaniel Floyd and the Granville County Floyds at the present time.

The Granville County Floyds had the first recorded birth of William, who was born in 1768. His father, also named William, served in the American Revolutionary War for North Carolina. He was married to Elizabeth.

In 1789, the younger William married Martha Hendisey and they had fourteen children together. The old Floyd home site is located near the Bear Pond section of Vance County. Some Floyds are buried there and the original home place is thought to be the original home site of William and Martha Floyd. William died in 1838 and his wife, Martha died two years later in 1840.

Pleasant Floyd, born in 1794, and was the son of William and Martha Floyd. Pleasant settled around and moved within the area called Wilton, North Carolina. Pleasant married Martha Fuller in 1821 and they had four children together. They were named John William, Lucy Ann, Amanda Abigail, and James Bell.

While living and married, Pleasant and Martha owned approximately 1,000 acres of land at what is now the fork of Cannady Mill Road and Highway 96 located in Granville County. Their original home place sat on the site of what is now the present day home of Mary and Richard Dixon, which is featured in the Heritage and Homestead - The History and Architecture of Granville County in North Carolina. The Floyd/Dixon home place is said to have been built by James Bell Floyd himself, or his son, J. W. Floyd around the late 1800's or early 1900's.

Pleasant and Martha were active members of the Banks United Methodist Church in Granville County, located approximately a mile from their home site and they are both buried there in 1858 and 1872 respectively.

John William Floyd, the oldest son of Pleasant and Martha, was a very active member in the church and became a Methodist Preacher. During his service as a Methodist Preacher, John William had preaching appointments in Granville, Wake, and Davidson Counties along with several other different counties located in North Carolina. He later died in 1885 in Boone, North Carolina where he is buried.

Lucy Ann Floyd, the first daughter of Pleasant and Martha Floyd, born in 1824 and died in 1891. She never married and she is also buried at Banks United Methodist Church.

Amanda Abigail Floyd, the second daughter of Pleasant and Martha Floyd married Edward B. Lyon. This family is also buried at Banks Methodist Church.

James Bell Floyd, the fourth child of Pleasant and Martha Floyd was born in 1830. He married Mary Susannah White, originally from the area called Wilton, North Carolina in 1852.

Mary Susannah White was the daughter of John and Hixey Cole White. The John White home site is also featured in the Heritage and Homesteads - The History and Architecture of Granville County of North Carolina. At present date, W.E. "Pete" and Eula Averette are now the owners of this historical home.

James Bell Floyd attended school at South Lowell, North Carolina, and taught school in communities called Mount Energy, Banks, and Roxboro located in North Carolina. He also served as a minister at several local churches and belonged to the Methodist conference. He served in the Militia during the Civil War as a Captain. His wife, Mary Susannah died in 1898 and James Bell himself died in 1915. They too are buried at the Banks United Methodist Church. James Bell and Mary Susannah had eight children together, two daughters and six sons.

Frank married and moved to Tennessee. James Pleasant was in the tobacco business in Oxford, North Carolina. Henry Coleman farmed the original John White land. John William and Charles Nicholson were both farmers and community leaders. Carolina Crews and Lavinia Fuller both lived in the Granville County area where they raised their families. Robert Pernell Floyd finished Charleston Medical College in 1878 and practiced medicine as a family doctor in Franklin County. He served the people of Franklin County as their County Representative in 1909 and 1911 in the North Carolina General Assembly in Raleigh, North Carolina.

There are many descendants of the William and Elizabeth Floyd family still living in the Granville, Franklin, and the Wake County areas, making a prosperous contribution to the health and history of North Carolina.

Thomas L. Cannady Family of Granville County

Although I have never lived in Granville County, my Cannady ancestors were first known to have lived there as early as 1798. Wagstaff Cannady was probably born in the St. Paul's Parish, Virginia ca. 1750. It was believed he came to Granville County because of the availability of land. The first recording we have of his presence in Granville County is the tax record of 1798 where he listed 473 acres in the Beaver Dam district. At the time of his death in Wake County in 1812 he and his wife, Behethland, are reported to have owned 1,113 acres in Wake and Granville counties.

Wagstaff's will, written September 26, 1809, mentions twelve children one of whom is Wyatt born in 1784.

Wyatt married Mary Elizabeth Hockaday, born in 1785, thus connecting two families with a long history in Granville County. The couple had fifteen children. Wyatt and one of his sons, Samuel, started Cannady's Mill, which was shown on the 1868 Township Map in Fishing Creek Township

of Granville County. The mill was located eight miles south of Oxford on the Tar River. The mill was named in County Court minutes as early as 1840.

Wyatt and Samuel also opened a store just above the mill where they sold flour ground at the mill and cotton cleaned at the Cannady's cotton gin. Cannady descendants reported that brandy and corn whiskey from a still were also sold. A slave named Beamus ran the still and was the millwright. At one time, the store was painted red.

After Wyatt's death on 30 April 1855, Samuel continued operating the mill. Wyatt was buried across the road from the mill in a family cemetery, which has become known as the "Wyatt Cannady Cemetery." His wife was later buried there, as have been several generations of Cannady's.

William Hockaday Cannady, another of Wyatt's sons, born 24 October 1882, married Elizabeth Jones H. Williams, born 29 June 1830. Their marriage bond was posted on the 8 April 1849. One of this couple's sons was Thomas Lawton, born 9 November 1852. Thomas Lawton became the next proprietor of the mill and store. He was my grandfather.

I understand that he and my grandmother, Sallie Jones Cannady, lived upstairs over the store when they were first married. They later had a house across the street where my father, Thomas Lawton Cannady, Jr. was born in 1905. A daughter, Louise, born in 1903 and a second son John born in 1910 may have been born in the same house.

The census of 1910 reports Thomas, Sr., was involved in merchandising and Sallie served as a saleswoman. Only two children are reported, Louise age seven and Thomas, Jr., age four. John was born after the census was taken.

My grandfather, like Wyatt, served as county commissioner. The store closed in 1910. For a while after its closing the building was used as a house and for storage. The store still stands today. Although the building is slowly falling down and it is badly in need of care, it is the only reminder of a once active business. The property has long since been out of Cannady hands.

My grandfather continued to farm at times, but also lived with us for almost a year when he was in his eighties. I loved the stories he told about the Civil War and how the Yankees stole potatoes from the family cellar.

My grandfather was a life-long member of the Oxford Baptist Church and while living with us, he wanted to attend church with a Baptist neighbor from across the street. My mother, Edna Fisher Cannady worried about him crossing the street since he used a cane. He was proud of the fact that he wore neither eyeglasses, nor dentures, even at this advanced age.

In the early 1940's, my brother Thomas Lawton Cannady III took a picture of Cannady's Mill. In 1944, a storm and flood washed away the dam. When the mill was to be torn down in the early 1950's, my father was fortunate to obtain the lumber and have it built into our dining room table, which I inherited after my mother's death. The table, in my possession, is considered a valuable reminder of the Cannady's long history in Granville County.

Yeargin and Moss Families of Granville County

Zebulon Vance Yeargin (1877-1947) was born in Granville County, and is buried in the Yeargin Family Cemetery, Creedmoor, Granville County. He married Viola Lillian Hughes, daughter of Oscar and Penny Hughes, in 1901 in Granville County. Viola (1880-1927) was also born in Granville County and is buried in the Yeargin Family Cemetery, Creedmoor, Granville County.

Zebulon Yeargin and Viola Hughes had three children. They were William David Yeargin (1902-1957), Geneva Lillian Yeargin (1904-1995) and Oscar Vance Yeargin (1909-1972).

Oscar Vance Yeargin was born in the Mt. Energy Community, Granville County, and also died in Mt. Energy. He is buried in the Creedmoor Town Cemetery, Granville County. Oscar married to Geneva Elizabeth Moss, who was known in the Mt. Energy Community as a loving mother, proficient homemaker and skilled seamstress. Geneva died at her home in the Mt. Energy Community at the age of 47, after seven years of illness with congestive heart failure.

After Geneva's death, Oscar married Lucy Perry Rogers in 1953 in Oxford, Granville County. Lucy (1904-1979) was born in Rolesville, Wake County, and is buried in the Creedmoor Town Cemetery, Granville County.

Oscar Vance Yeargin lived his life in the Mt. Energy Community, except for a very short time in his early 20s when he worked in Oxford for a tobacco company. Oscar was often called O.V. by the Mt. Energy neighbors and community members. He worked as a merchant in Mt. Energy for over 35 years. He first worked with his uncle, L.R. Hayes, in what was known as L.A. Hayes Store. He later ran it as O.V. Yeargin Grocery until the time of his death. He was also a landowner where tenants farmed. Tobacco, grain and hay were grown on his land. During World War II, he maintained a dairy farm and had "hired help" to milk the cows and prepare the milk for sale to a dairy company in Raleigh. His time was spent in the general store serving his customers and overseeing his other properties. He was a good provider for his family and sensitive to the needs of others in the community. Oscar Vance Yeargin died suddenly at the age of 63 of an apparent heart attack.

Oscar Yeargin and Geneva Moss had three children. They are Ramona Moss Yeargin (1929), Viola Lorena Yeargin (1930) and Janis Yvonne Yeargin (1935).

Ramona Moss Yeargin was born in the Mt. Energy Community, Granville County. She married Craven Earl Byrd in 1953 in Durham County. Craven was born in 1929 in Durham County.

Viola Lorena Yeargin was born in Oxford, Granville County and married James Howard Conyers in 1950 in Franklin County. Howard was born in 1929 in Franklin County.

Viola Lorena Yeargin and James Howard Conyers had one child, Jane Starr Conyers. Jane was

born in 1957 in Durham County and married Glenn Layman Martin in 1983 in Franklin County. Glenn was born in Rockingham County in 1957. The children from this marriage are Geneva Elizabeth Martin, born in 1986 in Guilford County, and William Conyers Martin, born in 1992, also in Guilford County.

Janis Yvonne Yeargin was born in the Mt. Energy Community, Granville County. She married Frank Edward Bourner in 1958 in the Mt. Energy Community. Frank was born in 1931 in Huntington, Cabell County, West Virginia.

Janis Yvonne Yeargin and Frank Edward Bourner had two children. They are Susan Daye Bourner, born in 1960, and Karen Dawn Bourner, born in 1962.

Susan Daye Bourner was born in Wetzel County, West Virginia. She married John H. Madigan in 1988 in Beckley, Raleigh County, West Virginia. John was born in Monmouth County, New Jersey in 1958. Susan and John had one child, Elizabeth Moss Madigan, born in 1993 in Washington DC.

Karen Dawn Bourner was born in Wetzel County, West Virginia. She married Edgar Eugene (Gene) Gibbons in 1989 in Beckley, Raleigh County, West Virginia. Gene was born in Greene County, Tennessee in 1965. Karen and Gene had two children. They are Grace Bourner Gibbons, born in 1996 in Guilford County, and Sarah Yeargin Gibbons, born in 1998, also in Guilford County.

Blackley Family in Granville County

"Again has Granville county been called upon to mourn the loss of one of its best and most influential citizens. William Alexander Blackley was born September 11th, 1836, and died at 10:30 o'clock on Wednesday morning, the 5th day of February, 1908. He was married to Eugenia Lou Minnis January 1871, and no more devoted couple could be found in any community. As they were rarely separated in life, so death did not long keep them apart, for she followed him to the brighter land within three days, dying at 6 o'clock, on the morning of Saturday, February 8th....

"Together with all other noble young men of his neighborhood, Mr. Blackley quickly responded to his country's call in 1861 and joined Company E., 15th Regiment, which belonged to Cooke's famous brigade, and was a worthy comrade of those who on so many battlefields shed luster on the name of North Carolina. Patient, self-sacrificing, persistent and brave, he made the ideal soldier, and his conduct in war was but indicative of his whole course in life. Never sensational, never timid, always cheerful, attentive to duty, industrious and firm in his adherence to principle, he became a bulwark of defense to the cause in the dark days of reconstruction and a faithful counselor and leader for his party in the days of their prosperity.

"It has been vouchsafed to few men to wield more influence in his neighborhood and section than

to W.A. Blackley, and it is a proud and comforting thought to his children and grandchildren that that influence was always for righteous living, whether in the family circle or in his relations to his church and his country. For many years, Mr. Blackley was a justice of the peace and his advice and counsel was sought by the rich and poor alike; everybody having confidence in the accuracy of his judgment and his sterling integrity...."

The above excerpts are from the memorial tribute, written by Judge A. W. Graham, published in the February 28, 1908 issue of The Oxford Public Ledger.

William Alexander Blackley, known to family and friends as Alex, was born in Granville County, son of James (ca.1796-1852) and Elizabeth "Betsy" Ann Cooke (ca.1808-1889) Blackley. His grandfather, James (by 1767-1803), who in 1788 married Phoebe Smith (by 1770-1834), was the first of this line to migrate to Granville County, probably coming with the Alexander Snelling family in the mid 1700s. James Jr., born ca.1796, died in 1852, leaving his widow with three minor children: William Alexander, Rufus H., and Shemuel Claiborne (1840-1885) Blackley.

When North Carolina entered the War Between the States, Alex and Rufus quickly enlisted and were assigned to Company E, 15th NC Regiment. A year later, brother Shem enlisted, leaving their mother alone, anxiously waiting for word of her sons. Alex and Shem survived, Rufus did not. In December 1862, age 22 and unmarried, he was mortally wounded.

Alexander Blackley served with his company from his enlistment in May 1861 until paroled at Appomattox in April 1865. During his tenure he received four promotions, ending his service with the rank of 1st Sergeant. He was captured at Crampton's Pass, MD in September 1862 and confined at Fort Delaware, DE until he was transferred and exchanged at Aiken's Landing, VA. He immediately returned to duty, but was wounded in the hip at Fredericksburg. By January 1863 he was back on active duty and except for a couple of brief hospital stays for illness was active until the end of the war. He was listed as a prisoner of war with Lee's Army of Northern Virginia before being paroled.

Alex returned to live with his mother, assumed responsibilities for their farm and began to participate in civic affairs. He was a 3rd degree Mason, accepted into the Franklinton Lodge in 1869. He married Eugenia Evline Minnis of Franklin County. Eugenia, known in the family as "Lou" and in the community as "Miss Lou," was the daughter of Benjamin Wright (1815-1841) and Emily R. Cooke (1816-1897) Minnis. Her grand-parents were Alan and Susannah Morgan Minnis and Howell and Leah Kearney Cooke (daughter of Shemuel Kearney, Sr. of Granville and Franklin Co. and his 2nd wife, Catherine Farmer). While attending Ladies' Seminary in Graham, NC, Eugenia completed a cross-stitched sampler which has survived.

The couple spent the first years of their marriage in the Franklinton area, where all of their children were born. Since they were both in their thirties when they married, they did not think they would have a large family. Much to their surprise, they were blessed with seven children - six lived to adulthood.

Francis "Frank" Minnis Blackley (1872-1944), married Florene Elizabeth McGhee (1876-1926). Frank had a twin who died shortly after birth. They had five children: Annie Mae Blackley (m. Alexander Somerville Powell), Alexander Minnis "Buck" Blackley (m. Allie Montague), Eleanor Lou Blackley (m. Dewey Worth Massey), Gladys Graham Blackley (m. Josie Shore Bobbitt), and

Julia Clair Blackley (m. J. Spencer Pulley).

Katy Moss Blackley (1874-1961) married Phillip Allen White (1868-1936) and moved in 1902 to Wake County. They had seven sons and one daughter: Percy Livingston White (m. Mae Elizabeth Southhall), Willard Allen White (m. Hoye Jones), Halbert Francis White (m. Evie Marie Scarboro), Katie Bet White (m. Louis Lambeth Liles), Waldo Reid White (m. Ruth Mayo Cherry), Durward LeGrand White (m. Mary Elizabeth Eakins), Ashley Glenn White (m. Loree Honeycutt), and Wallace Wilcox White (m. Martha Marietta Whitley).

Rufus Benjamin "Boot" Blackley (1875-1920), married Zelma Bragg (1887-1965) and had seven children: Ellie Lou Blackley (m. Garland Currin), Alene Blackley (m. Dennis Grady), Rufus Bragg Blackley (m. Mozelle Ripey), Robert Wilson Blackley (m. Loree Strickland), Ruth Rose Blackley (m. Fred Page), Stephen James Blackley (m. Dorothy Brake), and Edgar Jenkins Blackley (m. Frances Hunter).

Twins, Doza Wilson Blackley (1880-1966) and Oza Webb Blackley (1880-1969) did not marry. The twins were named for ministers who had served the Franklinton/Wilton area. They always dressed alike and were inseparable. They were close to their brothers and sisters and assisted in the rearing of many of their nieces and nephews.

Allie Cook Blackley (1882-1970), married Oscar L. Fuller (1874-1920) and had one son, Walter Edwin Fuller (m. Sue Britton).

About 1885, the family moved to larger quarters in the Wilton area of Granville County. Both mothers, as well as Eugenia's uncle, Young A. Minnis, came with them and remained a part of the household until their deaths. In addition to farming, Alex operated both a livery stable and a grist mill, so the farm was a bee-hive of activity every day.

Both Alex and Eugenia died at their Wilton home from pneumonia, a complication of tuberculosis. They are buried in the Howell Cooke Family Cemetery, located on Hwy #1 near the Franklinton exit.

Judge Graham ended his tribute with:

"The many deeds of kindness, acts of charity, love and sympathy of Alex Blackley and his wife (for to mention one was to recall the other) will be remembered and cherished for years to come by people of that section of the county; ever ready to respond to the call of the needy whether for counsel and consolation in times of distress and sickness, or for assistance in time of want, they endeared themselves to all with whom they came in contact. And they have left an example that must have its good influence upon their community for years to come."

William Beaver Family of Granville County

William Beaver first appeared on the Granville County Tax Roll in 1771. This is probably about the time he first arrived in North Carolina from Virginia. We know he was in Amelia County Virginia in 1757 because we know by record that his son Jeremiah was born there. He was likely a son of James Beaver appearing on Amelia County records beginning about 1746. We don't know if he moved to Granville directly or in a series of moves. The next record was when William and a John Beaver signed the Pledge of Allegiance in Granville County at the same time in 1778. In September 1779 he received a grant for 300 acres on Island Creek and a few months later John received a 300-acre grant on the adjacent land. Island Creek is located near the juncture of the Granville, Vance and Virginia lines. This plus later events indicate they were related, possibly brothers, cousins, or other close relation. Probably not father-son but this is not certain. The Granville County Tax Roll in 1771 lists William Beaver with two polls. This may indicate that John was living with William. The Granville County Militia Record of 1778 listed a John Beaver, age 22, a shoemaker in Captain Taylor's Company; William Beaver age 16, a planter in Captain Searseys' Company; James Beaver, age 20, a planter in Captain Knight's Company.

William sold his land to William Bullock in 1784 and moved to western Caswell County where he bought land on Rattlesnake Creek. Not long after, John also moved to Caswell County. It is not certain if John is the same one listed on the 1778 Granville Militia Record or the one that bought the land adjacent to William. When he moved to Caswell he settled in the tax district adjacent to William and assumed the tax liability of land formerly held by a Benjamin Beaver. Could this have been John's father? No other record has been found for Benjamin before 1785 or after 1788. Young James on the 1778 Granville Militia record didn't follow the other Beaver families to Caswell and may be among those that moved into Wake and lower counties. William remained in Caswell County and died there about 1809. I have found no connection between the Beaver families in Granville County and those in the area of Rowan and Cabarrus Counties.

The name of William's wife is not known. The only children of record were:

1. Jeremiah - b. 5/19/1757, Amelia Co., VA, d. 1/1845, Caswell Co., NC
2. Johnston - married Polly Nunnery, Caswell Co. 1792
3. Patsy - apparently never married (given William's Bible 1808 by prop. deed)

Other possible names were William, James, Jesse, Nancy, Joshua, and Joel. The following marriages are of those children suspected of being William's: Jesse married Mary Richardson 1786 in Caswell Co., Nancy married Richard Mayo 1795 in Caswell Co., Joshua married Polly Carroll 1793 in Caswell Co.

William's son Jeremiah served three enlistments in the Granville County Militia 1780-81. One enlistment, according to his pension record, was to serve as escort and guard to the Governor of North Carolina on his journey from Granville County to his residence in Newbern, reviewing troops along the way.

There is no record of Jeremiah's marriage or his wife's name. He would have turned 21 about 1778 and his probable first child Solomon was born in 1780 while Jeremiah was away with the Militia.

This is where we get the only clue to his wife's name. When Jeremiah made his pension application in 1833 a woman named Judith Long of Caswell County made her affidavit proving Jeremiah's Revolutionary Service by saying that when she was a little girl she stayed with her pregnant sister, Jeremiah's wife, while he was away in the war. Thus far we have been unable to determine if Long was the maiden name or married name of Judith.

Jeremiah moved to Caswell County in 1784 and settled near his father William. He died there in January 1845. I discovered his grave in 1994 in an abandoned wooded graveyard full of fieldstones and sunken graves off Ashland Road about 300 yards from Pleasant Grove Primitive Baptist Church in Caswell County. Of the 50 or so gravesites, his was the only one with a stone with any markings and are dim and full of misspellings. On Sunday June 4, 1995, the William Bethell Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution formally dedicated his grave and a bronze marker was set in a granite stone alongside the original headstone. An American Legion - VFW Honor Guard fired a traditional soldier's burial salute.

Jeremiah's children were:

1. Solomon - b. about 1780, Granville Co. d. after 1850, Caswell Co. m. Nancy Browning, Caswell Co. 2/24/1809.
2. Jesse (probably) - b. about 1782, d. after 1820, Rockingham or Caswell Counties, m. Jerusha Wynn 6/25/1810, Caswell Co. (Jerusha and all children appear to have moved to Person County after Jesse disappeared from records in 1820).
3. Judith or Judah - b. before 1786, m. Barsillai Gomer 1814, Caswell Co.
4. Elizabeth A. - b. about 1796, Caswell Co., d. after 1860, Caswell Co., m. John Walker 12/18/1813, Caswell Co.
