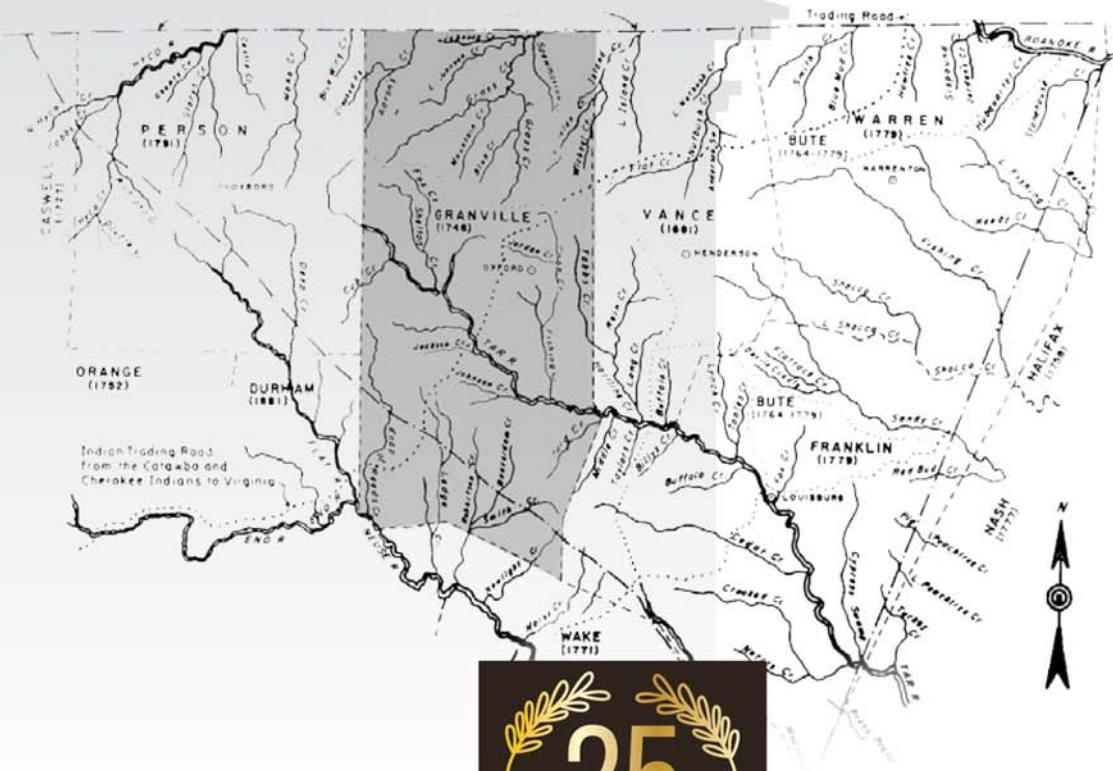

From the President—

I don't know where to start with my message for this publication due to being quarantined for so long. As soon as I got off one stay at home order another order took its place. The first order was to keep me from catching cold and other bugs after surgery and the second was to keep me from catching the virus. One good thing came out of this was that I have made good use of my time at home. I have been getting my family files better organized and able to find what I need to look for.

With access to all of the research websites on the internet has been most helpful in my research. I found that one of my ancestors was honored with a Southern Cross of Honor for his military service. That was quite an honor.

There is so much information on the internet now and we don't have to travel to another city to obtain it. Birth indexes, death certificates, wills, estate records and dozens of other documents can be found. A word of warning. If the documents are copies of the originals that is fine, but if it is something transcribed by a person, look for a copy of the original. When people put information on these websites, they tend to sensationalize the information to make it look good, when it may not be all truth as the original.

I am getting a bit antsy with our library being closed to the public. I really miss being able to go to our North Carolina Room to get the information that I need. The staff has been very helpful with my requests.

We had to cancel our monthly meetings due to the virus and the stay at home order. We decided to postpone our meetings until September to help keep everyone safe.

I recently received a phone call from one of my relatives in Massachusetts wanting to know if I

would help them identify people in some photographs they had. I told them that I would be glad to help them. Well they sent me a scrapbook full of pictures with no names. Well to my surprise the scrapbook was a gold mine for me. In it I found a lot of pictures of my family. One picture stood out and it was a picture of my younger brother that I had never seen him dressed in a suit and tie. It happened to be his wedding picture. His only daughter did not have a copy of this picture. Another picture was of my older brother in his WWII uniform. I did not have one of him in his uniform. He was wounded in the invasion of Normandy and when he was discharged from the military service he went to night school and obtained his electrician license and soon became the Chief Engineer for Berkshire Hathaway Mills.

Recently I had a request to do some research on people from Granville County who served in the War Between the States. Some interesting figures were found. There were over 2000 whites that served. The counting so far on the blacks who served was 42 and I have not counted the Indians who served. The last pensioner to draw a pension was Frank McGhee who lived to be the age of 112. He was black. Also, I looked at the soldiers who lost limbs and received artificial limbs after the war was 27. A huge untold number of soldiers lost limbs and lived without these limbs the rest of their lives.

Well I have been rambling enough so I will get back to organizing my files and cleaning up my research space.

Robert Eldridge Harris Family

Robert Eldridge Harris was born February 9, 1820, died December 28, 1889, and is buried at Harris Chapel United Methodist Church, Vance Co., NC. He married first to Martha Ann Clark on November 12, 1842 in Warren Co., NC. She was born about 1828, and may have died shortly after the birth of her son George Robert Harris in 1853.

Robert had four children with Martha Ann.

1) James Thomas, b. April 21, 1845, d. August 7, 1911, m. Lucy William Ball (b. August 16, 1861, d. May 10, 1933, daughter of William Ball and Elizabeth Adams) December 18, 1876 in Granville Co., NC. He was a sergeant in the CSA and their record has him born in Franklin Co., NC. He and Lucy are both buried at Harris Chapel United Methodist Church, Vance Co., NC.

2) Mary E., b. about 1847, Granville Co., NC, died about 1871 at or shortly after the birth of her daughter, Mary "Molly" Elizabeth Adams (b. April 20, 1871). Mary E. had married Nathaniel B. Adams on December 28, 1867 in Granville Co., NC, son of Edmund Adams and Lucy Falkner. He was born April 1838 in Virginia. Nathaniel B. Adams married a second time to Georgianna Clark on February 25, 1873 in Kittrell, NC.

3) John A., b. April 10, 1849, d. December 31, 1914, m. Mary Elizabeth Vaughan, daughter of Jim Vaughan and Martha Brame. She was born May 10, 1835 and died April 11, 1915. Both are buried at Harris Chapel United Methodist Church, Vance Co., NC.

4) George Robert "Bose/Bosy", b. September 9, 1853, Granville Co., NC, d. about June 10, 1917 and is buried in an unmarked grave at Island Creek Church, Granville Co., NC. He married Martha (Pattie) Susan Brame on December 25, 1872 in Granville Co., NC. She was born about 1857 and died before December 30, 1916.

Robert married second to Martha Adams on December 22, 1859 in Granville Co., NC, daughter of Edmund Adams and Lucy Falkner. She was born August 10, 1834, died March 1, 1914, and is buried at Harris Chapel United Methodist Church, Vance Co., NC.

Robert and Martha bought their farm in the Watkins community, Vance County, NC from Jasper H. Parham and wife Lucinda K. Parham, borrowing (note on farm) \$550 from George B. Harris and Dr. F.R. Harris. George B. Harris and Dr. F.R. Harris were brothers, and the sons of Benjamin Franklin Harris and wife Ann Rogers. It is not known if they are related to Robert Harris. After the death of Robert in 1889, Robert and Martha Adam Harris' son, Benjamin Franklin Harris said that he and his father bought the land together and farmed the land together. Robert would have been about 64 years old at the time of purchase. Benjamin finished paying off the note, providing a home for his mother until her death in 1814 and his sisters until they married.

A letter written by Mary Jane Adams Tucker to her brother Robert Adams, dated 24th January 1890 has the following:

“Well it was a very sad Christmas with us. We were at Mr. Harris all the Christmas. Mr. Harris was taken sick on Monday. He was parrylized and never did speak or notice anything and he lived until Friday Night. He was a good man and I hope he has gone to rest. I never saw no body have more attention from everybody as he did while he was sick.

He bought him a nice track of land and had a nice house built on it about 5 years ago. His younger son bought a part of the track. He takes care of his Mother and four single sisters. He hires hand and makes good crops.”

The home of Robert and Martha Adams Harris is still standing at 245 Walker road (state road #1123) off of Horse-Shoe Bend Road (Vance Co.) and 158 E. of Oxford, NC.

Robert had seven more children with Martha.

5) Edward Wesley, b. March 11, 1861, d. November 11, 1935, m. Meta Earl Brummitt, daughter of Samuel Brummitt and Martha Gill. She was born February 1, 1870 and died November 23, 1949. Both are buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Henderson, NC.

6) Joseph N., b. 1863, m. Lula M. Barker, on December 20, 1885 in Vance Co., NC, daughter of John Barker and Harriet Stone. She was born in 1867. Both are buried near Portsmouth, Virginia.

7) Benjamin Franklin, b. January 18, 1867, Vance Co., NC, d. October 22, 1946, married Alice Victoria Clark on February 24, 1900, daughter of McDonald Clark and Virginia Parrish. She was born September 2, 1877 and died March 16, 1963. Both are buried at Harris Chapel United Methodist Church, Vance Co., NC.

8) Lucy Virginia "Jennie", b. July 7, 1869, Vance Co., NC, d. March 17, 1947, Vance County, NC, m. William Henderson Wade, Jr. January 6, 1892 in the bride's home in Vance Co., NC. He was the son of William Henderson Wade, Sr. and Lucy Twisdale. He was born March 16, 1861 in Person Co., NC and died January 21, 1941 in Vance County, NC. Both are buried at Herman United Methodist Church, Vance Co.,

NC.

9) Pattie D., b. November 15, 1871, Vance Co., NC, d. July 22, 1944, buried Harris Chapel United Methodist Church, Vance Co., NC, m. Henry Thomas "Tommy" Williams, son of Leslie G. Williams and Mary D. Barker. He was born March 3, 1872 in Vance Co., NC and died August 29, 1954. Tommy Williams is buried at Harris' Chapel United Methodist Church, Vance Co., NC in an unmarked grave beside Pattie. Tommy Williams was married the second time to Crystal Bobbitt.

On August 3rd in 1866 Silas Gooch and Lucinda Cooper, recently freed people of color, walked into the Oxford Courthouse to register their marriage of 14 years. Their committed relationship, formed during slavery, had survived slavery, a revelation that dispels the misleading myth of the dysfunctional Black family that is, at best, a late 20th Century phenomenon. Amidst dusty books and faded folders their third great granddaughter has found record attesting to the ancestors' social and material accomplishments.

Enslaved by Hester and Gooch families of Oxford, Silas, once freed, registered to vote and became active in the community's civic life. However, North Carolina passed the 1900 disenfranchisement amendment stripping Black men of their right to vote. It was not until the 1960's that Silas's descendants regained it.

Undeterred, Silas and Lucinda worked as tenant farmers while raising livestock for themselves. Census and school records show they had between 10-12 children. Tax lists and chattel mortgages show that Silas often borrowed money to sharecrop; most often he put up personal property such as an ox and cart, a mule, or barn of tobacco as collateral. An 1886 North Carolina Tobacco Belt Directory entry indicates Silas Gooch owned 120 acres in Oxford. Most of his children became landowners.

Family oral history holds interesting stories about "Pa Silas". One story says he protested slavery by frequently running away, but hid nearby to support his family. "Patterollers" (or patrollers) tried many times to catch him. Silas would kill dogs sent after him by ripping their jawbones. Meanwhile, he "borrowed" pigs and other farm animals to feed himself and his family.

Silas' church and community held him in high esteem. In 1925, New Light Baptist Church honored the patriarch on what was then believed to be his 109th birthday, attracting more than 500 people (including children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren) to the celebration that featured preaching, music and

food. The Oxford-Public Ledger covered the event, referring to Silas as the "oldest man in Granville County." The ledger also pointed out his reputation as a dexterous farmer noting: "He is in good health and is able to walk and do much work. Three years ago he made more corn with a hoe than a great many farmers did with three teams."

Indeed, well beyond retirement age, Silas wielded a grubbing hoe to clear new land, often helping relatives tend their gardens. The grubbing hoe, for the Gooch family, symbolizes our faith and self-sufficiency. Our ancestors who, with the help of this common, ground-breaking tool, ultimately overcame the exploitive systems of slavery and sharecropping to raise stable families and own land. We embrace the ancestors' legacy and wish to do them proud: "Sons and daughters pick up your grubbing hoes and create what you need. Grow your own and you will never go hungry." Silas died in 1927. He has hundreds of descendants.

Clay Family

The Clay Family originated from Captain John T. Clay, born 1587 in Monomoth Shire, Wales, England. He married Anne Nichols 1618 in London, England. John T. Clay the Grandier (hired soldier in the King's army) arrived in the New World in Feb 1613 according to the muster on the ship "Treasurer". John Clay was the first of this family in Virginia. He was living at Jordan's Journey, Charles City County, Virginia in 1625 when he made muster of this family in the census that year. According to abstracts of Virginia Land Patents, John Clay received 1200 acres of land in that county (100 acres to him as an old planter before the government of Sir Thomas Dale, and the other 1100 acres for transportation of 22 persons from England). The descendants of Sir John Clay (1558-1632) and Wife Mary Carlton are John Clay (1587-1655) of England, Charles (1638-1686), Henry (1672-1760), John (1718-1762), Rev. John Clay (1741-1781) of Virginia and Henry (1771-1852) of Virginia and Kentucky. Sir John Clay was knighted by Edward IV at the Battle of Tewkesburg, England in May 1471. Henry Clay, son of a Baptist Minister, was a US statesman. He was an unsuccessful candidate for President three times and became Secretary of State under President John Quincy Adams.

The Clays migrated to Granville County, North Carolina from the Amelia County, Virginia area in the late 1700's. One of the earliest Clay family marriages in Granville County was John Clay and Hannah Crawley, Aug. 1797. Records also show that the Clays sold land in Granville County in 1810. The Archibald Mitchell Clay family settled in the Fishing Creek Township of Granville County, Oxford, North Carolina located five miles south on Hwy 96.

Archibald Mitchell Clay (Feb 1821-Nov 1881) was son of Charles and Permelia T. Mitchell and grandson of Peter and Dosha Johnson. He married Catherine Young Montague in May 1846, daughter of Lewis Montague and Hicksy Buchanan of Oxford and they had 4 children, Robert William, Permelia, Charles Lewis, and Mary Frances. Robert married Mamie E Jenkins in Jan 1892 from Littleton, NC. Permelia D. born Jan 1847, died at Clay Station. Charles Lewis born Sept 1848 married Nannie Peebles from Brenham, TX, and died in Moody, McLennan Co., TX. He graduated from Wake Forest College, NC, attended medical school at the University of Kentucky in Louisville and did Post-Graduate medical training in New York City. They had 4 children, Archibald Robert, Charles Lewis, Henry, and Rupert Warren.

Mary Frances Clay born March 1853 died in Clay Station. Archibald Mitchell married Frances Lewis Montague (sister of Catherine Young Montague) in Oct 1855 and they had 4 children, Alpheous Archibald Clay, Lewis Young, Catherine Young, and Frances Lewis, Alpheous Archibald (Oct 28, 1859- Sept 1, 1897) married Melissa Catherine Barnes in Nov 1888. She was born May 10, 1863 and died Jan 28, 1949 at

Clay Station. They had 4 children, John Archie, Mary Lee, Robert Clay, and Alpheous Barnes.

John Archie (Jan 17, 1890-Aug 24, 1933) married Vivian Revis from Louisburg, NC, lived in Oxford, NC and was a Deputy Sheriff and jailer for Granville County. They had 7 children, Elizabeth, John Archie, Edith, Cynthia, Margaret, Ben, and Julia. Mary Lee Clay Feb 20, 1893-June 12, 1971 married Arthur Pitts from the Corinth Community of Granville County and they lived in the Pitts home place. Mary Lee attended Oxford College and taught school at Tar River in Granville County. They had 6 children, Martha Kathryn, A.D., Annie, Lizzie Lee, Loraine, and Madison. Robert married Ailene Usry from Corinth and they lived 2 miles south of Clay Station and later moved to Richmond, Virginia. They had 2 children, Mildred and Billy.

Alpheous Barnes (Oct 1897-Mar 1980) married John Royal (Roy) Preddy (Feb 1890-Jul 1943) from Franklin Co., NC and they had 9 children, John Royal, Jr., Ettie Cathryn, Robert Alpheous, Frances Clay, Paul Lofton, twins, Janet Marie and Janie Marion, Walter Troy and Grady Lee. The Clay families were farmers and raised tobacco, corn, cane and other feed crops on their farmland. They attended Corinth Baptist Church and Corinth School, which were located nearby in the community.

In 1889, Robert William Clay built a merchandise store in the community. It was also used as a post office and railway depot for the Durham and Northern Railway Company and became known as Clay Station. Robert was the first Postmaster from Oct 26, 1889-Dec 25, 1894. The post office served the Clay community from Oct 1889 to Feb 1910. In 1887 the Clay family gave the Railroad Company the right of way for train tracks on their land. In 1891 and 1924 the Clay family sold tracts of the Clay land to the Trustees of Belton Creek Colored Baptist Church.

The original Clay home place, built in 1802, was located across the highway east of Clay Station and in April 2002; (two hundred years later) will be occupied by Michael Craig Preddy and wife Christy. Craig is the great-great-great grandson of Archibald Mitchell Clay. Many of the Clay descendants still live happily in the Clay area of Granville County, North Carolina.

Goss Family

I am a descendant of Thomas Goss, Sr., the son of William Goss II, William Goss I and John Goss born in England. William Goss I lived and died in Kent Co., VA 1661. He married Elizabeth Dixon. His son William II, born about 1685, wife Mary Fleming married about 1730 and lived in NC before 1731. Thomas Sr. was born about 1730 and died 1816, in Granville Co., NC. He married Frances (Fanny) Sherman born ca 1773 and died 1824. They had the following children, Thomas Jr. (Patsy Putnam), Jemima (James Keday, Mr. Cogstall, Mr. Reas), Keziah (John Williams, James Kissery), Sherman Sr. (Rachel Badgett, Lively Goss), Sally (Mr. Anderson, Mabin Crenshaw, William Hobgood), John (Rehab Crenshaw), Fanny (Lewis Roberts), Elijah (Nancy Bullock/widow of Mark Minor), Mary (Thomas Cozart), Elizabeth Patsy (Frank Hobgood), Elizabeth (John Meadows), Rebeckah (James Oakley), Cela (Ransom Parrish), and Nancy (James Mangum). He served in the Carolina Militia, in 1754 and was a Patriot in the American Revolution. He received in 1781 forty-three pounds for service and supplies and 1783 was awarded 9 pounds on his claim for Revolutionary Services. (Proof for military service Militia Granville Co., NC 1854, voucher records proof for 1781 and information's obtain from DAR records by Billie Gene Horner.

Thomas Jr. born 1754 in Granville Co. and died 1833 in Habersham Co., GA, married Patsy Putnam born 1760 and died 1825 in Habersham Co., GA. The children are Benjamin (Martha "Patsy" Harbin), John

(Charlotte Drayton), Thomas, Melissa, Matthew, Mary (George Washington Black), and Roland (Barbara Waller). He served in the Revolutionary War from North Carolina.

Roland Goss was my great-great grandfather. He was born 1807 and died 3 October 1886 in Granville Co. He married Barbara Waller 19 November 1829. Barbara was born 1815 and died 12 November 1896. The children are Elizabeth (Bettie), William (Rebecca Green), Rowland (Frances Cash), Lively (Preston Nance), Elijah (Eliza Jones), Henry Mason (Jeannie Adcock) Benjamin Frank (Ada Adcock), Mary, Nancy (Henry Bullock), Elizabeth (Berons).

William and Rowland both served in the Civil War. William and Rowland served in Company E 46th Regiment, North Carolina Troops. From the NC Troops Book Vol. XI compiled by Weymouth T. Jordan, Jr. and 1850 census records.

Benjamin Frank Goss is my great grandfather. He was born 15 June 1857 and died 24 May 1924. He married 1 September 1822, Ada Adcock born 9 April 1860 and died 29 November 1922. Hearsay is that she died at a quilting. The children are Robert Lee (Betty Walker), Purvis (Allie Boling), Alex (Frances Bowling), Irvin (Bessie Adam), Lillie (Anjel Monroe Addison, Sr.), Hallie (H.T. Walker), Earlie (Dora Walker), Loucretia (Joe Bailey), Graham (Annie Cash), Bud Roland (Effie Humphries), Luther (Esther Grissom), Tom (Allie Tilley), Euell (Myrtis Walker), Annie (Tom L. Ward), Nola (Willie Inge), Dorsey (Cornelia Cozart), Pearl Mageline, Julie, and 2 infants died without names.

My grandfather was Bud Roland Goss. He was born 7 April 1892 and died 22 November 1989. He married 17 October 1920, Effie Humphries born 23 July 1902 and died 31 January 1962. The children are Thomas (Ruby Coley), E.B. Roland (Mildred Currin), Lucille (Maynard Ross, Roscoe Richards), Maxine (George Jackson) and Ruth (C.H. Puryear).

My father was E.B. Roland Goss. He was born 12 February 1931 and died 27 October 1963 from an automobile accident. He married Mildred Currin, 12 September 1952. She was born 28 August 1929. The children are Sandra, Karen and Jerry. In the year 1999, Sandra is married to Tony Aiken and has one daughter Eugenia and lives in Stem, NC. Karen is married to Michael McLendon and has one daughter Tracy and lives in Creedmoor. Tracy is married to David Creech and lives in Knightdale, NC. Jerry is married to Carol Nelson and lives in Person County, NC.

Caiaphus Shepard Allen

Caiaphus Shepard Allen, born July 6, 1880 in the Brassfield Township of Granville County, was the second child and only surviving son born to Joseph Dupree (Joe) Allen (1851-1921) and Emma Elizabeth (Bettie) Jeffreys Allen (1856-1891). In 1891 when Caiaphus was only 11 years old, his mother and two year-old brother Lamar died within a week of each other. It is not known how soon after their mother's death, but Caiaphus and his 14 year old sister Annie went to live with their mother's sister, Caroline, her husband Sam Moss, and their four children whose farm was in the vicinity of the current South Granville Country Club. Their father, Joseph, was listed as a widower living alone in the Tally Ho district of Granville Co. in 1900. Here he was in business with his brother Zach and Walter G. Averette. The Allen Averette Co. was a combination general store, railway station, and post office located at Providence Station near the Tar River where Joe Allen served as the postmaster for over 13 years.

As a young man, Caiaphus farmed with his uncle Sam Moss during the summer and worked as a store clerk in Creedmoor for his brother-in-law I.W. Bullock during the winters.

Later he farmed with R.W. Bullock and was employed by the Imperial Tobacco Company of Great Britain and Ireland. Eventually Caiaphus joined his father, Joseph, and uncle Zach in the Allen-Averette Co. business in Providence where he kept books while continuing to farm.

On November 4, 1908 Caiaphus married Mamie Lyon (1881-1964), oldest child of local farmer Edward Dewitt Lyon (1853-1929) and Dora Susan Mitchell Lyon (1860-1903) at Bullock's Methodist Church in Hester. Between 1910 and 1913 Caiaphus and Mamie purchased three adjacent tracts of land which included a farmhouse and approximately 123-acre of land just north of Creedmoor. In 1911 Caiaphus left the Allen-Averette Co. in Providence to devote all of his time to farming. With the help of tenants and hired hands, Caiaphus raised flue cured Virginia tobacco, a variety of vegetables and grains, and livestock. Following the death of his brother Zach in 1915, Caiaphus' father, "Pa Joe", left the business in Providence and came to live with his son on the Creedmoor farm until his death in 1921.

Caiaphus and Mamie had three children. Their first child, Edward Dupree Allen, was born in 1909 while the couple was living in Providence. Referred to as "Buddy", "Cap", and Edward by his father, mother Mamie always called him Edward. Ed never completed high school but did earn a degree from King's Business College in Raleigh. As a young man in his early twenties he took his knowledge of tobacco to Canada where he did very well for himself and retired as president of the Canadian Leaf Tobacco Company. Though Ed married, raised a son, and spent the rest of his life in Canada, he return to Granville County frequently to visit family and call on old friends. When he died in 1988 his body was returned to be buried with his parents in the old Creedmoor Cemetery.

Caiaphus and Mamie's second child, Blanche was born in 1914 after they moved to the Creedmoor farm and named for Mamie's younger sister who had died as a small child. Blanche wanted to be a teacher, but the family could not afford to send her to college, so after being sent to business school by brother Ed, Blanche worked for the state for many years. She never married and lived with her mother until Mamie's death in 1964 and then alone in a small house on the farm until her own death in 1995.

Mitchell Jeffreys Allen, named for both of his grandmothers (surnames) was born to Caiaphus and Mamie on November 4, 1919 in the front room of the family farm house, and at 82 years of age still occupies the same house with his wife of 56 years, Vermale Rich Allen. Mitchell attended Creedmoor High School where his favorite subject was history. Caiaphus died when Mitchell was only 14 years old, and though he had to work the family farm, Mitchell found time to play basketball and baseball including a few seasons in the early 1940s as a pitcher for the original Durham Bulls team. From 1940 - 1947 he worked seasonally for the American Tobacco Company while continuing to farm at home, and in 1945 he met Ludie Vermale Rich from Durham on a blind date and married her 6 months later. In the 1950s Mitchell and Vermale bought the family farm from Mamie.

Caiaphus was described by son Ed to have physical features similar to those of his father, Joe: fair complexion, blue eyes, brown hair, and average build. In 1930 he suffered a heart attack and lived in poor health until his death 3 years later at the age of 53. Mamie, a tall thin woman was a seamstress and an accomplished pianist. A widow for over 30 years, she never remarried and remained on the farm the rest of her life living for many years with her daughter Blanche, and then later with her son Mitchell and his family. She died Halloween night in her home of over 50 years.

Boyd Family

William Boyd married Lydia Hart on 30 November 1842 in Granville County. He is head of his household in the 1850 Census in the Goshen Township of Granville County. He is stated being born in Tennessee and North Carolina in two different census records. At this time, it is unclear where he was born. Lydia and all of their children stated being born in North Carolina. They had the following children: John H., Sallie "Sal", William "Bill" Washington, Elizabeth "Bettie/Dink", Mary, James "Jim" W., Spencer "Wag", Parthenia "Sis" P., Martha Anne and Joseph "Joe" Benjamin.

John was the oldest child and he enlisted in the North Carolina 55th Infantry, Co. K at the age of 18 on February 25, 1863 for the War Between the States. He was captured at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania on July 1, 1863. He was confined at Fort Delaware, Delaware on July 6, 1863. He died in the hospital at Point Lookout on December 6, 1863 of "smallpox". He is buried there in an unmarked grave. His family told the story of the day he left to join the war. "The soldiers were riding from house to house getting the men to join. He did not want to go and leave his family but his father said he should go. It was a cold day with snow on the ground. His mother wrapped him some food in brown paper and placed it in a sack with some winter clothes. His sister, Sis recalled John sitting in the saddle on his father's white horse when she handed him the sack. Sis also recalled that their "Muh" and all the children were crying. They never saw him again and were not sure when or where he died."

Sal married James Currin and lived in Granville County. She is buried in the Gregory Cemetery on the left side of Hwy. 15 North between Lewis (Station) and Gela (Station). James never remarried after Sal died. James is buried at Stovall Baptist Church. They had the following children: Ella, Bettie Ann, James Madison, Mollie and Lillie.

Bill first married Mary Ellen King and lived in Granville County. They had the following children: Hebert (married Ida Mae Stainback); Roy (married Lizzie Woodlief); Crawford (married Annie Lee Barrier); Hattie (married Esse Woodlief); Aline (married Charles Boyd); Anna (married John Henry Beaver); and Ida (never married). Mary Ellen died and Bill married Mary "Mollie" Rebecca Grisson Miller. She had 1st been married and divorced to Frank Miller and they had one daughter. Bill and Mollie had the following children: Willie Bell (married Coley Lewis Campbell); Jesse (died as a small child); Tazzie (married Ollie Williford); Johnny (married Rita Grimes); Andrew (married Mae Jackson); Vallie (married 1st Willie Lee Fuller and 2nd William Lane); and James Emmett (married Katherine Lunsford). Bill, Mary Ellen and Mollie are buried at Stovall Baptist Church.

"Dink" married William "Bill" Henry Faucette (he had 1st been married to Mary Matthews and they had children) and they had the following children: Emma (married Thomas Grisson), Nancy (married John Anderson Beal), Otis (married Martha Guerrant), Elizabeth "Liddie/Littie" Belle (married John Fred Smith) and Thomas (never married). Dink and Bill are buried at Stovall Baptist Church.

Jim married 1st Julia Ann Hudson and they had the following children: Mary "Mollie" (married Early Wilson), John Fleming (died as a small child), and Ada (married 1st Willie Dickerson and 2nd Wilbur R. Davis). After Julie Ann died, Jim married Martha Tucker and they had the following children: Bettie (never married) and Alice (never married). Julia Ann and John Fleming are buried at Mountain Creek Baptist Church. Jim, Martha, Bettie and Alice are buried at Island Creek Baptist Church. Mollie, Early, Ada and Willie are buried at Stovall Baptist Church.

Wag never married and lived with his parents until they died. He had a nervous breakdown as a small child when his brother John left for the war. He never recovered from the fear of soldiers and strangers. When his

parents died, he went to live at Dorothea Dix Hospital in Raleigh for treatment. He died and is buried at the hospital.

Mary never married and lived with her parents until the death of her sister, Sal. Then she lived with her sister Sal's family to help with the housework and the rearing of the children. She lived with them until her death. She is buried at Stovall Baptist Church.

Sis married James "Jimmy" Wyatt King and they had the following children: Rebekah "Beckie" Frances (married John William Arrington), Robert Marshall "Marsh" (married Mary Amy King), William Spencer "Spence" (never married) and Mary Lydia (married Samuel O'Briant). Jimmy died when his youngest child (Mary) was nine months old. He was helping to clear land (a log rolling). He was lifting a log and the other man dropped his end causing Jimmy to rupture his spleen. He died a few months later and Sis and the children moved in with his brother's family (Billy and Bettie King) until the children were older. Spence was a deaf-mute from birth. He attended the School for the Deaf at Morganton, NC and received a good education. Jimmy is buried at Providence Baptist Church. Beckie and John are buried at the Satterwhite Cemetery. Mary and Sam are buried in Durham.

Ann married Spencer Currin and they had the following children: John Spencer, Troop, Willie Lee, Lizzie, Mary Eliza, Maggie and Annie. Ann and Spencer are buried at Tabb's Creek Church.

Joe married Mary Gardner Craft and they had the following children: Walter, Ollie, Lonnie, Bessie, Effie, Lola, Bonnie, Nellie and Hollie. Joe and Mary are buried at Elmwood Cemetery in Oxford.

John Laughter Family

The Laughters settled in early Granville, later Butte/Warren Co., NC. They lived close to the Virginia border on Hawtree Creek. According to the will of Henry Laughter, he was the son of John Laughter. Henry married Mary Hogan, daughter of William Hogan. Children of Henry and Mary as listed on the will are John Lawter (married Mary Langford), William Lawter, James Lawter (moved to Rutherford County and married Charlotte Hicks), Benjamin Lawter, Chloe Lawter, Mary Lawter, Sarah Lawter and Elizabeth Lawter. Inventory of the estate mentions "a few hatter tools". Henry's son, John Laughter was a Hatter during the American Revolution and made hats for the Rev. Army as well as participating in the Battle of Guilford Courthouse.

John Laughter and Mary Langford were the parents of William Laughter (married Frances Hunt, daughter of James Hunt and Nancy Satterwhite on May 4, 1807 in Granville County), Rebekah Laughter, Polly Laughter, John Langford Laughter (married Ann Mary Hunt, daughter of James Hunt and Nancy Satterwhite on Aug. 8, 1809 in Granville Co.) and Susan Laughter.

John Langford Laughter and Ann Mary Hunt lived for many years on Hawtree Plantation in Warren County. He was a well-known teacher and surveyor. He served in the War of 1812. He went in as a Captain, but was soon promoted and served until the close of the War as Colonel of the 2nd NC Dragoons. On his return to Hawtree Plantation in Warren County, he was made General of Militia, but he preferred the title of Colonel as he had won that in actual warfare in the face of the enemy. They were the parents of Henry Michael Laughter, Frances Laughter (married William Wortham, Apr. 28, 1834 in Warren Co.), Robert William Laughter (born Mar. 15, 1817 in Warren Co., died May 15, 1863 in Richmond, VA, married 1st Elizabeth P. Bartlett on Dec. 19, 1836 in Warren Co. and 2nd Nancy Evans on Jan. 12, 1841 in Warren Co.),

Ann Mary Laughter (married George H. Peagram on Feb. 14, 1838 in Warren Co.), Mildred Laughter, Penelope Laughter (married John Paschall on Dec. 23, 1843 in Warren Co.), John L. Laughter, Jr., Sarah Cornelia Laughter (married Fleming Currin on Oct. 14, 1850 in Granville Co.), William Hunt Laughter (married Mary Thomas, buried Hollywood Cemetery, Richmond, VA) and Maria Louise Laughter (married James Lampkin on Dec. 3, 1865 in Warren Co.).

Robert William Laughter was the father of Alice Laughter, Estelle Laughter, George Laughter, Lucy Laughter, Richard Laughter, John Evans Laughter (married Sarah E. Wright on Jan 21, 1867), Miles Richard Laughter (married Rebecca Rose, daughter of John Rose and Martha, on Mar. 11, 1869 in Halifax County), Peter Laughter, Robert Anderson Laughter, Martha Laughter (married Tommy Myric), James Bowers Laughter (married Mary Elizabeth Ayers), and William Penn Laughter (married Mary Missouri Daniel). I am a descendant of Robert's son, Miles Richard and I think all of these children were by Nancy Evans.

Miles Laughter and Rebecca Rose were the parents of Lucy Laughter (married Owen M. Gupton on Jan. 29, 1891 in Nash County), Nannie Laughter (married Robert Lee Kennedy, son of Orren Kennedy and Drucilla Edna Burton, on Apr. 26, 1893 in Nash County), Ruth Mary Laughter (married B.T. Guilford on Dec. 20, 1893 in Nash County, NC), James Richard Laughter (married Nancy E. Valentine), Martha Kendrick Laughter (married Charlie Wesley Kennedy, son of Orren Kennedy and Drucilla Edna Burton, on Dec. 25, 1904 in Nash County), Daphene Laughter (married Madison Strickland) and Alice Laughter (married Rev. Albert Lester on Feb. 16, 1908).

Annie Pearl Kennedy and Samuel Edgar High were the parents of Patricia Ann High (married 1st William Roger Bailey, 2nd Billy Lane Nelson), Samuel Edgar High, Jr. (born Jul. 7, 1943, died Apr. 17, 1961 in Nash County, buried in Red Oak Cemetery), Barbara Jean High (married David Lee Tyre).

Patricia and William Bailey, a.k.a. Bill Bailey, are the parents of William Roger Bailey, Jr. (married Janet Seagroves), Mitzi Gaye Bailey (married Mark Wilson), Cynthia Delaine Bailey (married Thomas Goerke) and Donna Leigh Bailey (married Eric McGee).

Mitzi Bailey and Mark Wilson are the parents of two daughters, Lyssa Nicole Wilson and Ashley Michelle Wilson.

Donna Bailey and Eric McGee are the parents of two children, Bailey Lauren McGee and Eric Tyler McGee.

Nelson Grey "Buddy" Blackwell

It was with some reluctance in November, 1940 that Mr. and Mrs. William Roy Blackwell and their 2 small sons, Johnny, 4, and Nelson "Buddy", 3, left their neighbors and friends in the Salem Township and moved to the farm home which they had acquired 4 miles south of Oxford on Hwy. 15. This house, the former Tilton Barnett place, had been built around the turn of the century. Buddy remembers the day on which they

moved as being extremely windy and cold. Sitting in front of a rocking chair on the living room floor with a fireplace for warmth, he remembers seeing a man "crawling in and out of the ceiling" where he was pulling cords, replacing the old carbide lights with electricity.

The Blackwells had not established themselves long in their new home when Mr. Blackwell welcomed news that milk routes were about to be established in the area. He got busy and got together a small herd of Holsteins. Over the years, summer time on the Blackwell Farm was exceptionally busy for the family. Conserving the family's food supply from the garden gave extra work to Mrs. Blackwell, and Buddy's sister, Jayne (born 7-6-1944), who also was helpful as a hander during the leaf harvest.

In the summer time, when the tobacco harvest was pushing all members of the family, feeding and milking the herd began shortly after 4 a.m. and was completed in time to make a full day in the fields.

After graduation from Oxford High School in 1956, in addition to helping his father on the farm, Buddy went to work at Pine State Creamery, the company to which the Blackwells sold their milk. He continued there until 1963 at which time his father's health declined and he returned to the farm full time. After Mr. Blackwell's death in 1977, tobacco on the farm was discontinued. However, Buddy operated the dairy until 1991 at which time surgery on both knees forced him to retire. Buddy's mother, Mariah Rogers Blackwell, died in 1995.

Life on the Blackwell farm has changed dramatically in the past decade. Although the old dairy and tobacco barns stand still, life is much less stressful for Buddy, now age 64, as he rides his grandson, Nelson, along the farm paths on the golf cart to check on horses being boarded in the back pasture. He remains an avid outdoorsman.

Buddy still resides with his wife of 36 years (the former Judy Hart) in the brick house, adjacent to the home place. Judy is a 28-year employee with Granville County. They have 2 sons, Nelson "Grey", Jr., born 11-19-1969 and William "Carl", born 3-2-1972, both graduates of North Carolina State School of Design.

After graduation from college, Nelson "Grey", Jr. moved to Atlanta, Georgia where he worked at the Gainesville Times and the Atlanta Journal - Constitution. In 1997, he and his wife (the former Shields Brewer) returned to Granville County and now reside in the recently renovated home place with sons, Nelson Grey, III, born 4-2-1999, and Robert Daniel, born 12-11-2001. Grey is Graphics Editor at the News & Observer in Raleigh and also has an office behind his home from which he does freelance illustrations for various magazines. The view from his office window includes the old dairy barn and farm buildings, a reminder of the many years of hard labor and love that have gone into this Granville County farm.

Carl resides in Mebane and is a Graphic Designer in Educational Media Services at Duke University Medical Center.

Buddy's brother, Johnny, retired from Export Tobacco Co. and resides in Wilson, NC. He and his wife (the former Suzanne Gano) have two children: Glenn Thomas, born 10-24-1963 and Virginia Beth, born 3-14-1966. Glenn married Susan Wiggs. They have 2 daughters, Shelby, born 7-31-1992 and Kaitlyn, born 4-26-1997 and reside in Wilson, NC. Beth married Michael Habig. They have a daughter, Morgan, born 9-13-1993 and reside in Cary, NC.

Buddy's sister, Jayne Howard, retired from Granville Medical Center and still resides in Oxford. She has two daughters: Amy Gray, born 10-6-1966 and Cynthia Thomas, born 4-22-1970. Cyndi resides in Vance County. Amy married Robert Charles Schumann. They have a daughter, Sadie Jane, born 7-6-2000 and twin sons, William Charles and Robert Thomas, born 2-3-2002 and reside in Durham, NC.

The Frazier Family of Granville County

The Frazier family of Granville County has long been a formative part to county history since the eighteenth century, when Jeremiah Frazier purchased 200 acres of land from Simon Day on February 23rd, 1756, and again on Fishing Creek from Thomas Howell on December 2nd, 1757, and August 4th, 1767. Jeremiah Frazier, who married Fathy (Faithy), has always been known to have at least five sons, according to Granville County records, which include Jeremiah Frazier, Jr. who married Betsy Melton; John Frazier (who granted his "brother Howell Frazier" a power of attorney in 1819); Philip Frazier (who received a deed of gift from Jeremiah, Sr. in 1802); William Frazier (whose will in 1819 mentions his brother Howell); and Howell Frazier, the uncle and guardian of Nancy Frazier in 1818, daughter of Jeremiah, Jr.

Malachi Frazier (who died in 1784) and William Frazier (who died in 1793) have always been considered his brothers. Thanks to Revolutionary War pension application indicating the soldier Sowell's birthplace as Bertie County, and his having come to Granville County at the age of six weeks with his parents (William, the son of Daniel and his first wife, whose name is unknown), it has always been thought that the entire Frazier family was from Bertie County. Frazier Folks and Related Families (available only at the Oxford Public Library), the authority on Daniel Frazier's Granville County descendants, says they were probably transported, Scottish, Jacobite Rebels, supporters of exiled King James II, from Preston, Lancashire, aboard the ship Susanna, bound for South America from Liverpool on May 17, 1716. A Daniel Frazer, along with a Hugh Frazer and a William Frazer, was aboard this ship. It is eventually in Bertie County, where Daniel Frazier lived between 1728 - 1764, and appears to have married Judith Hill, according to Moses Hill's 1762 will. Moses Hill was probably the grandson of another Moses Hill, who arrived in Bertie County around 1711.

On the other hand, a Daniel Frazier was also listed, as the son of John Frazier in his February 17, 1743 will in Carteret County and was an heir John and Mary's estate, along with his brothers John, James, Thomas, and sister Mary. Mary Frazier was named as the daughter of John Falconar (Faulkner), a planter in Chowan County on his will of July 28, 1739 and probated in August 1741.

However, the absence of Jeremiah Frazier within Bertie County records has long been a source on frustration towards establishing his family in Granville County. Jeremiah Frazier was one of the executors of Malachi Frazier's will in 1783, along with Ephraim, Jeremiah Frazier, Sr.'s grandson (William Frazier's son) and Malachi's wife Sarah. However, it is presumptuous to assume that Jeremiah Frazier was the brother of Malachi, considering it is not uncommon, in 18th century wills, for friends of the family to act as executors of a loved one's will. Other than in Malachi Frazier's will no records exist solidifying a connection between Jeremiah's family and Daniel's family. In addition, the discovery in St. Paul's Parish records of Jeremiah, Philip, Philemon, and William Frazer, lends credence to the possibility that Jeremiah Frazier was from Hanover County, Virginia, traveling to Granville County like many other families of this era. Incidentally, Frazier, Fraizer, Frazer, Fraser, Frayser, and even Freasure or Freazure can be found used interchangeably in most colonial records.

Jeremiah, Philip (who might be Philemon), and William appear there between 1740 - 1796 and a "Widow Frazer" is listed between 1731 - 1739, possibly their mother. A large Melton family lived in Hanover County, including an Elizabeth Melton, also listed in St. Paul's Parish Vestry Book and Jeremiah Frazer, whose will is mentioned in land tax books of Hanover County in 1793, conveyed 100 acres to William Frazer, who married Elizabeth Mitchell on February 12, 1778. Frazier families abound in this area of Virginia, adding to the possibility that two separate Frazier families met in Granville County, where they would have almost certainly known each other as distant or no-so-distant family.

A William Frayser left a will on December 30, 1733 and included his eldest son John, middle-most son William, youngest son Philemon, and daughters Rebecca Frazier and Martha Stone. William was to receive 5 pounds "when of age", and wife Hannah and son John were executors. Since this will, written and recorded in Henrico County in 1733, doesn't mention Jeremiah, the chances are William is not the father of Jeremiah. An entry from the vestry book of St. John's Church for March 2nd, 1732 in Henrico County shows a more probable source. St. John's Church records a payment to Sarah Herbert of 200 pounds of tobacco "for buying John Frayser". This corresponds closely with the first entry in St. Paul's Parish of "widow Frazer", who may have moved there after John's death. A Henrico County deed between John Simcock and William Cannon to William Frazure "of Burton Parish, York CO, planer", points out an even more probable origin for John Frayser of Henrico County, whose name is recorded in a court order from March 24, 1697 until July 1697, an action of debt followed by an action of defamation in Yorke County, Virginia. A John Fraser is also being transported on John May's October 20, 1704 patent along the Mattepony River (nearer Hanover County) in Essex County. Since few records are available in Hanover County, where they were burned during the Civil War, further research bringing to light the true origins of Jeremiah Frazier would be well advised.

The Fraser family of Lord Lovat of Inverness, Scotland traces its origins to the fabled Julius De Berry in A.D. 916, reported to have provided an important service to Charles Simplex, King of France during the visit of the Papal Nuncio, the Pontiff's Representative. In return for regaling him with dishes of ripe strawberries, De Berry received the royal command, and his name was changed to Praise, the French word for strawberry. Ever since, the Fraser coat of arms has been adorned with the three strawberry blossoms.

Both branches of the Frazier family play a part in my personal pedigree. Lucey Frazier, 1791 - 1859, who married James Currin on October 11, 1808, was a daughter of Jeremiah Frazier, Sr. and Faithy (Fathy). Mary Frazier daughter of William Frazier (who died in 1793) was married to William Hester on December 27, 1780. The marriage bond between Robert Elliott and Charity Frazier, daughter of William, on September 3rd, 1791, is controversial and difficult to read, made more illegible thanks to the application of plastic tape to the original document. Hicks History of Granville lists the name as Charity Travis, although the Travis family is indigenous to Caswell County. Holcomb's Marriages of Granville County lists her name as Charity Trairer (Trailer?), but to the trained eye, she would almost certainly be the Charity Fraizer of Will Frazier's 1793 will.

Jeremiah Frazier, Sr. and Faithy's children were: Jeremiah Frazier, Jr. married Betsy Melton; John Frazier; Philip Frazier; William Frazier married Isabela; Howell Frazier married Nancy Hester; and Lucey Frazier married James Currin.

Daniel Frazier and Judith Hill's children were: Malachi Frazier (will of 1784) married Sarah; William Frazier (will of 1793) married 1) unknown, 2) unknown and 3) Mary; Reuben Frazier (Freasure) for Moses Hill's 1762 Will.
